FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE REGISTER AND HOW TO VOTE

What if no one is eligible to vote?

If no-one at your address is allowed to vote you must still return this form. Fill in parts 2 and 3.

IMPORTANT - If you are a citizen of a country NOT listed, you CANNOT vote - even if you are allowed to live in this country.

I live at two homes?

People who live at two homes are allowed to register for both, but cannot vote twice at the same election. For more advice ring the HELPLINE.

I'm a student living at two addresses?

Students living at a different address in term time may register there and at their home address. They may not vote twice at the same election.

I work abroad, or I'm homeless?

There are special rules to make registration and voting easier for:

- · people living and working overseas
- · homeless people
- · remand prisoners
- mental health patients in care

They must NOT be included on your form. Please ring the HELPLINE for more details.

When will the next Election be held?

The next known elections are the local council elections on 3 May 2012.

Elections may be called at any time. There may be a Referendum to decide whether to have an elected Mayor and an election to appoint the Police Commissioner.

Confirming by phone in other languages

To confirm by phone in another language, please FREEPHONE 0808 284 1506. You may confirm in Arabic, Bengali, Cantonese, Hindi, Polish, Punjabi, Somali, Urdu and Vietnamese.

IMPORTANT

You can be removed from the Voters' Register if you do not return the form. This means you could deny yourself and your household a vote and you could also have problems getting credit, as all major credit reference companies use the Voters' Register to check your address.

Nationality

Only British, Commonwealth, Irish & European Union citizens are allowed to vote. Your nationality will be shown on your passport.

EU citizens will be registered as local government electors only (except citizens of UK, Cyprus, Malta or the Irish Republic, who can vote in all elections). For more information about registering to vote in European Parliamentary elections, please ring the HELPLINE.

European citizens cannot vote at a Parliamentary General election.

Qualifying Commonwealth citizens are those who:

- have leave to enter or remain in the UK; or
- do not require such leave.
