Brandwood & King's Heath Ward Factsheet



Brandwood & King's Heath is a suburban ward located in the south of the city. It has a population of 18,970 making it the 30th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,101 children living in low income households in Brandwood & King's Heath, 24.1% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 54th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Brandwood & King's Heath stood at £192m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £10,359. Brandwood & King's Heath has the 33^{rd} largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
