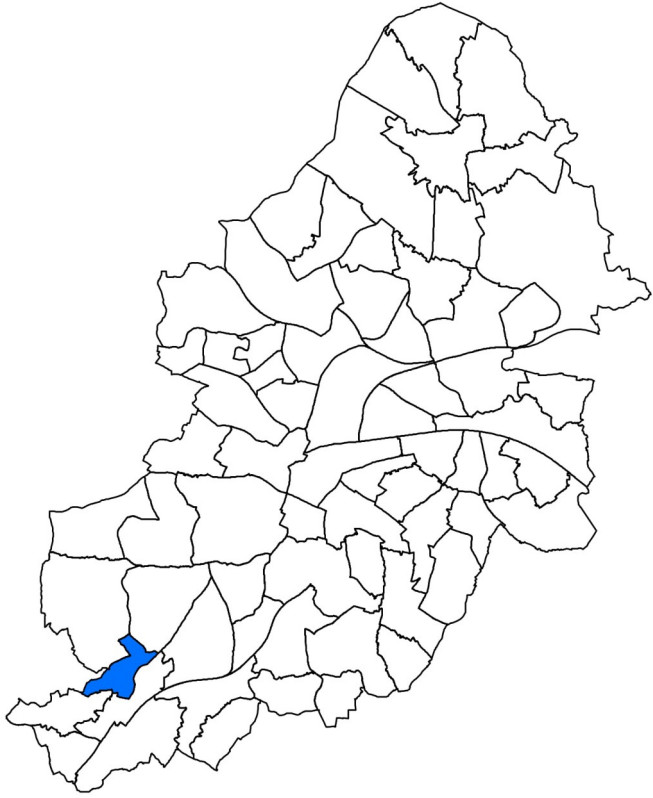


Allens Cross Ward Factsheet

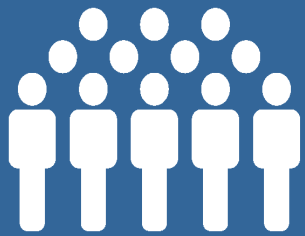


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Allens Cross Ward is located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 10,962 making it the 53rd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole but is less ethnically diverse.

Allens Cross is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation levels and average income. Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are slightly higher than the Birmingham average.

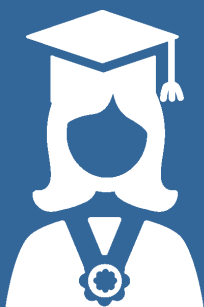

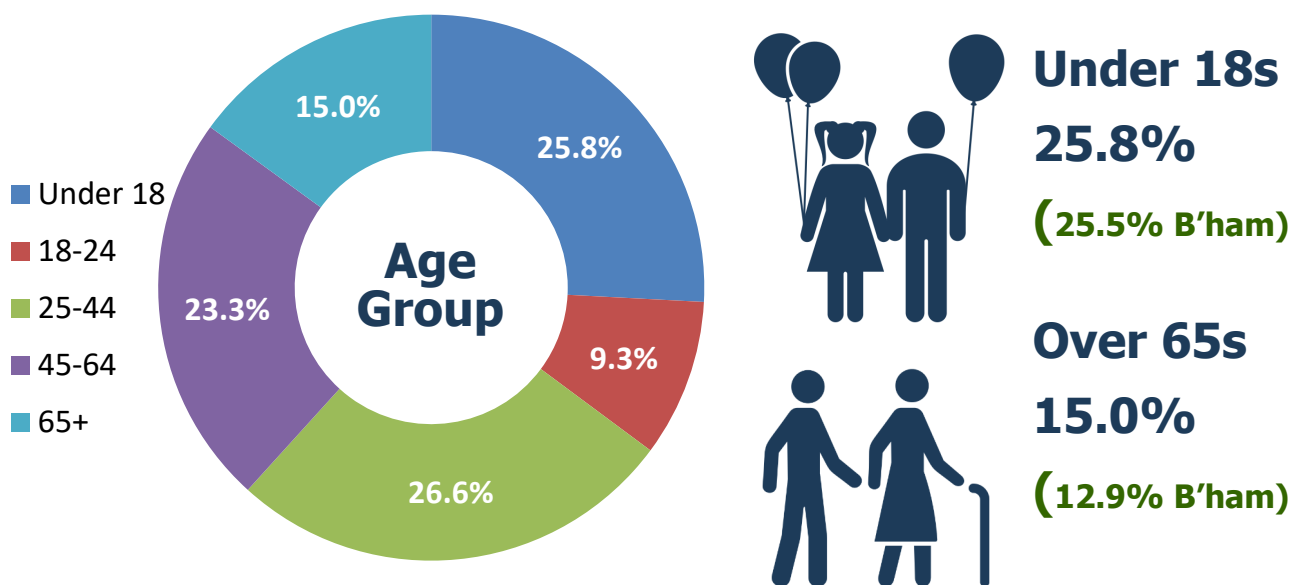

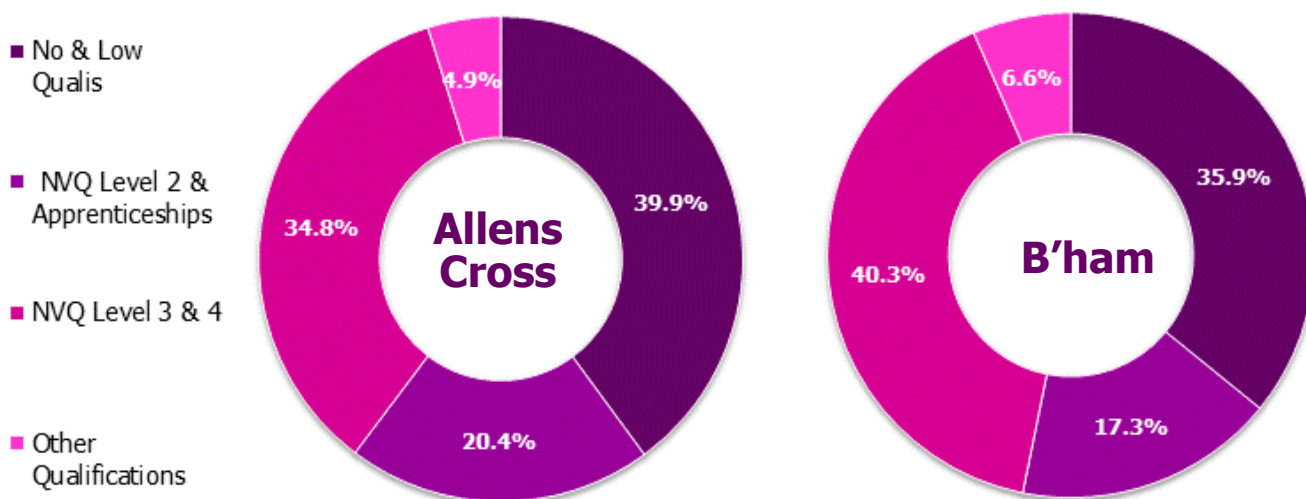
