Alum Rock Ward Factsheet



Alum Rock ward is located in the inner city to the east of the city centre. It has a population of 25,487 making it the most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a significantly younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Alum Rock is amongst the city's most deprived wards and has the highest share of working age residents with no qualifications out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty


Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 6,501 children living in low income households in Alum Rock, 62.4% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 2nd in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Alum Rock stood at £205m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £7,669. Alum Rock has the 28th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
