### **Birchfield Ward Factsheet**



Birchfield Ward is an inner city ward located to the north of the city centre. It has a population of 12,473 making it the 41st most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Birchfield is amongst the most deprived wards in the city and has the 15th highest share of working age residents with no qualifications out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are much lower than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.





#### **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,956 children living in low income households in Birchfield, 48.6% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 13<sup>th</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.





#### **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Birchfield stood at £50m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £3,994. Birchfield has the 2<sup>nd</sup> smallest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
