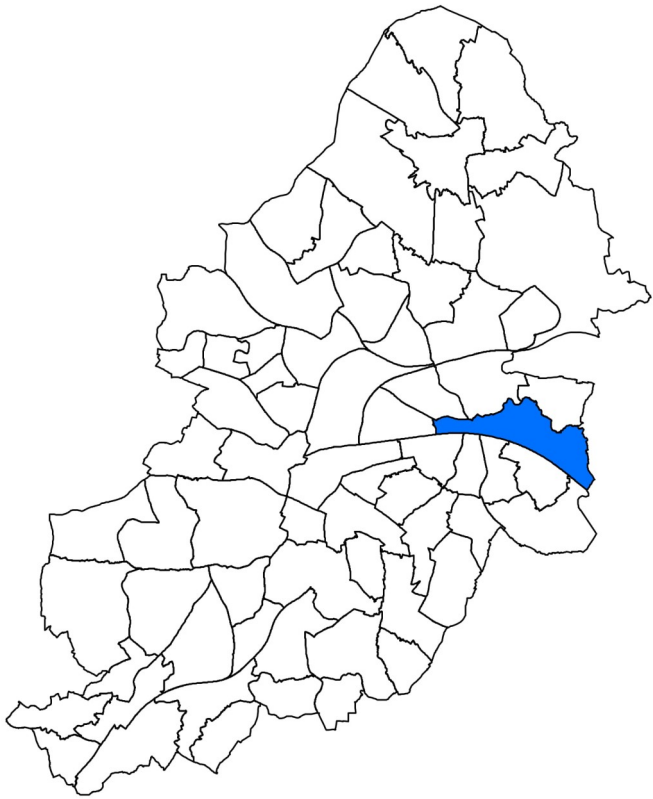


# Glebe Farm & Tile Cross Ward Factsheet



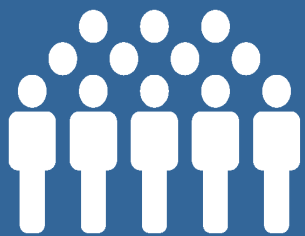
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Glebe Farm & Tile Cross is a suburban ward located in the east of the city. It has a population of 23,038 making it the 4th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Glebe Farm & Tile Cross is one of the more deprived wards in the city and average income levels are below the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

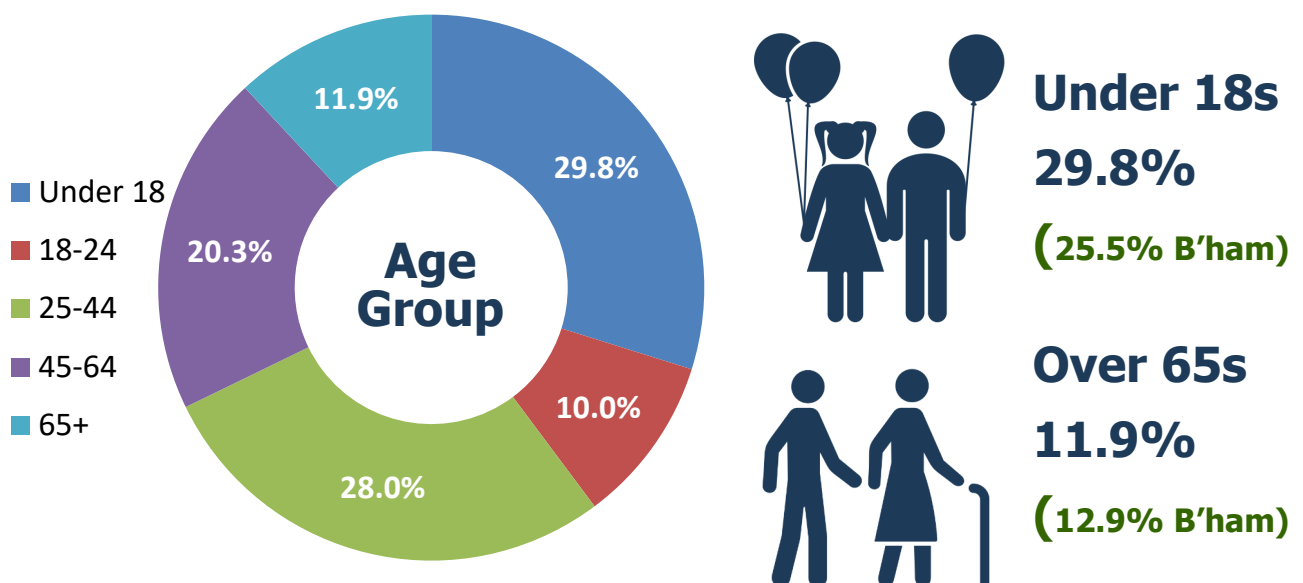

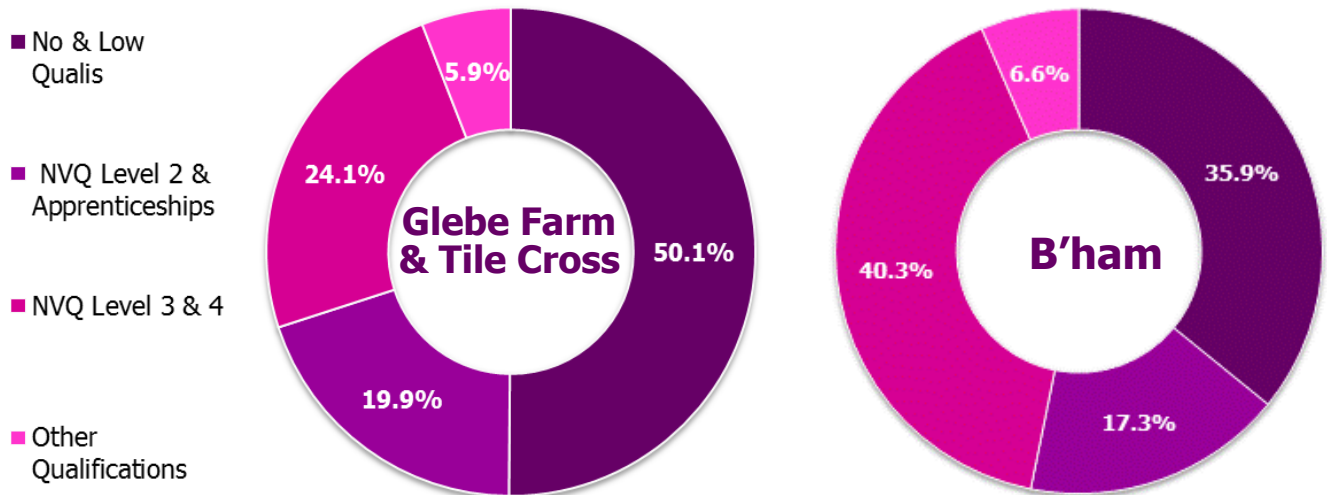
