Frankley Great Park Ward Factsheet



Frankley Great Park is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 12,657 making it the 40th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Frankley Great Park is just above mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation levels and for the proportion of working age residents with no qualifications.

Resident employment rates in the ward are a little above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are similar to the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,007 children living in low income households in Frankley Great Park, 28.2% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 48^{th} in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Frankley Great Park stood at £130m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £11,129. Frankley Great Park has the 46th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
