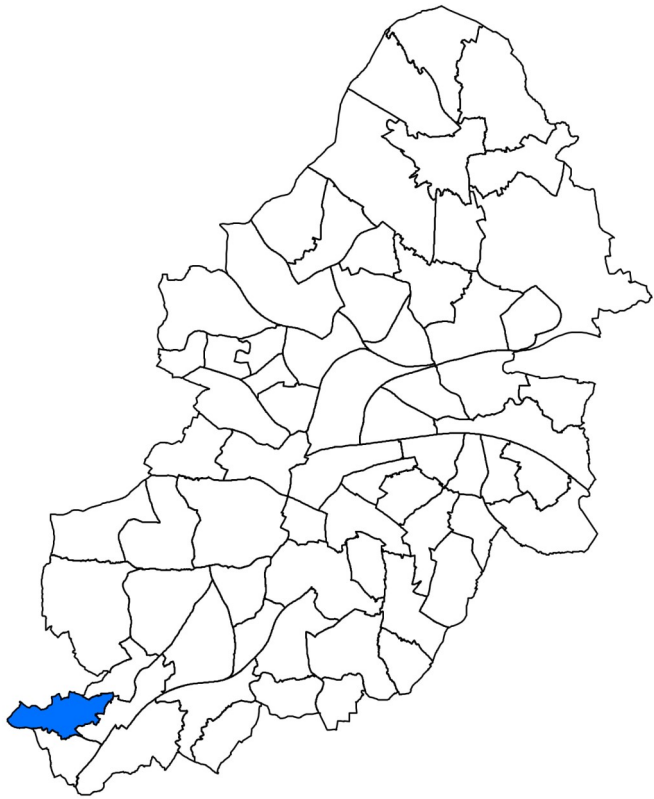


Frankley Great Park Ward Factsheet



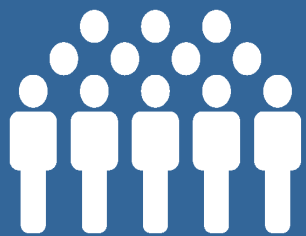
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Frankley Great Park is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 11,032 making it the 51st most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Frankley Great Park is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation levels and average income.

Resident employment rates in the ward are similar to the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

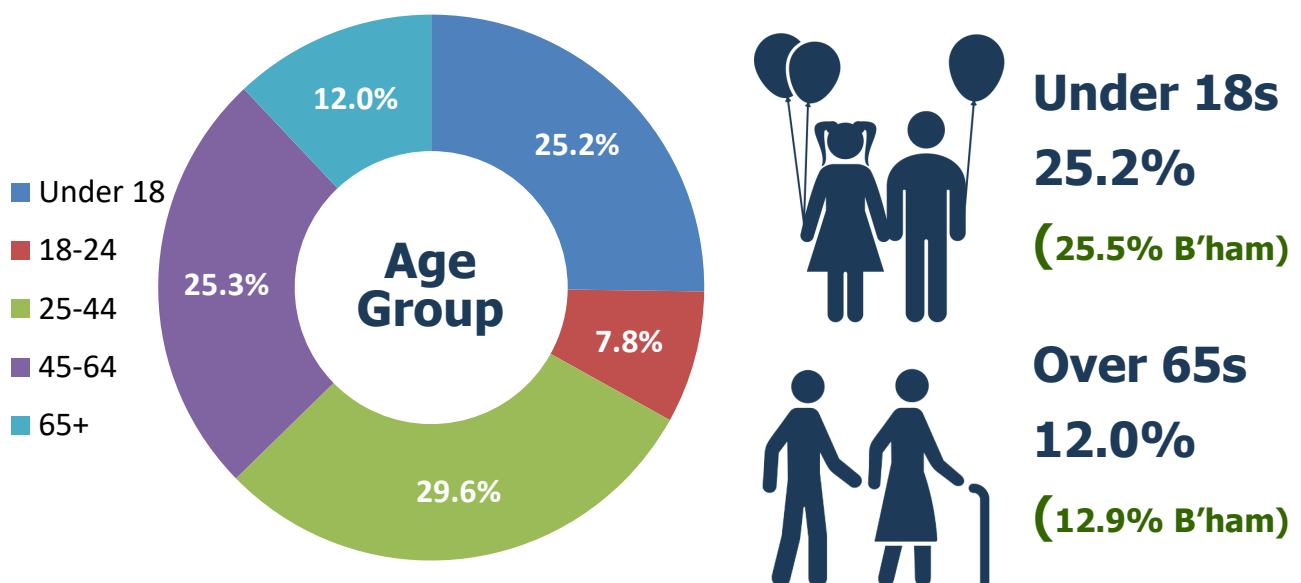

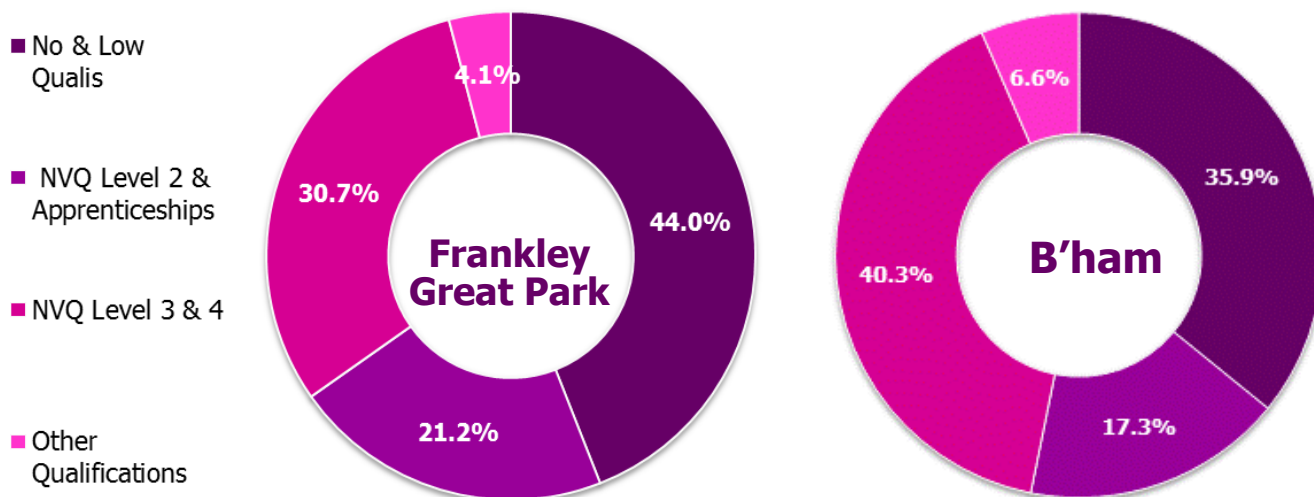
