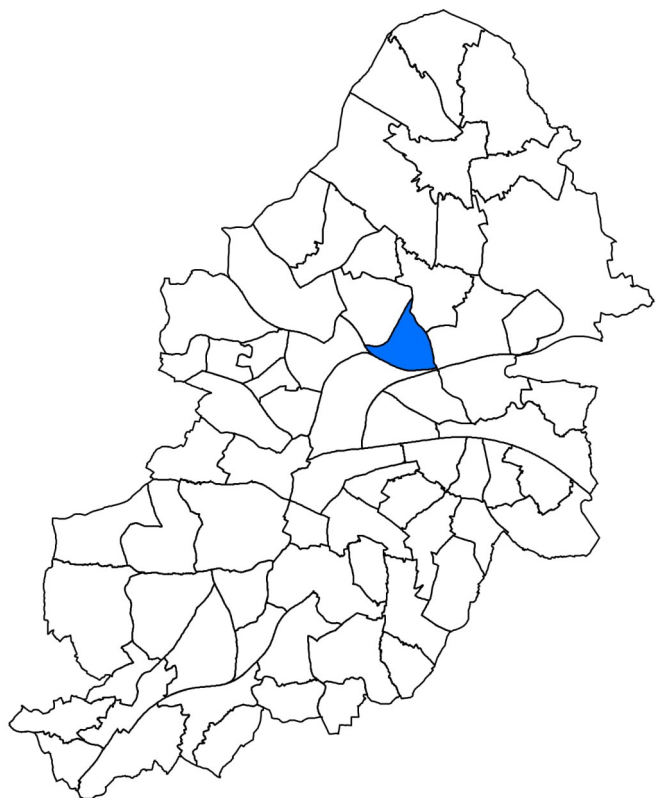


Gravelly Hill Ward Factsheet



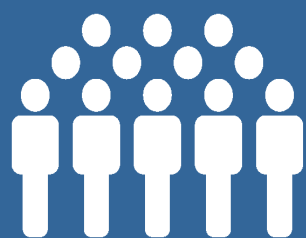
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Gravelly Hill is an inner city ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 9,875 making it the 63rd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a higher BAME population share.

Gravelly Hill is one of the more deprived wards in the city and average income levels are below the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

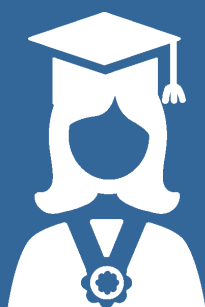

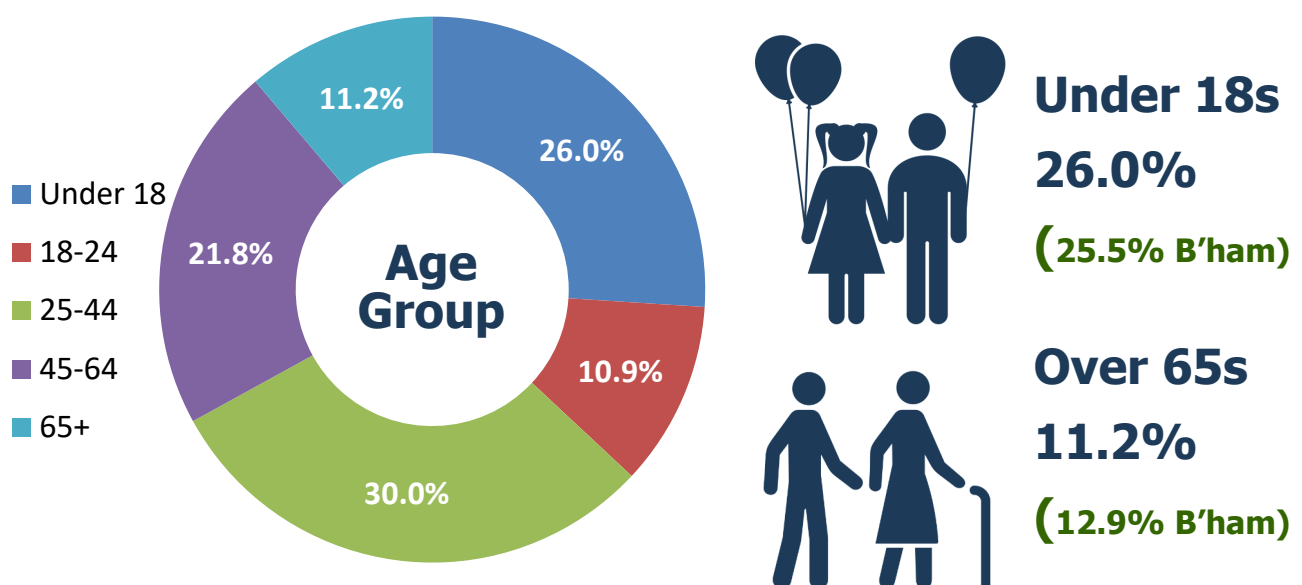

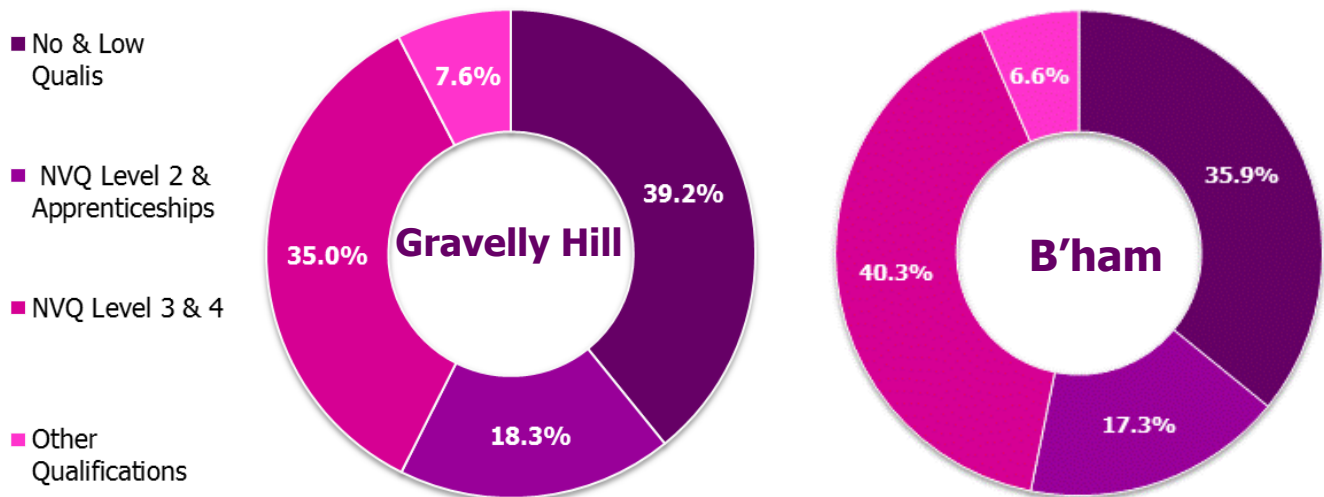
