# **Castle Vale Ward Factsheet**



Castle Vale is an outer city ward located in the east of the city. It has a population of 9,9311 making it the 66th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Castle Vale is amongst the most deprived wards in the city and has the  $12^{th}$  highest share of working age residents with no qualifications amongst the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are slightly below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are similar to the Birmingham average.







# **Child Poverty**


Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 918 children living in low income households in Castle Vale, 35.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 32<sup>nd</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



### **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Castle Vale stood at £630m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £65,336. Castle Vale has the 9<sup>th</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.



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
