# **Edgbaston Ward Factsheet**



Edgbaston is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 18,732 making it the 31<sup>st</sup> most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a very high proportion of young adults (18-24) due to a large student population. The area has a similar ethnic profile to Birmingham as a whole.

Edgbaston is amongst the least deprived wards in the city but the high proportion of students living in the ward impacts on employment rates in the ward, despite the ward having a high number of working age residents with huger level qualifications.







### **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 747 children living in low income households in Edgbaston, 12.1% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 61<sup>st</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

#### **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Edgbaston stood at £1,501m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £67,902. Edgbaston has the 4<sup>th</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
