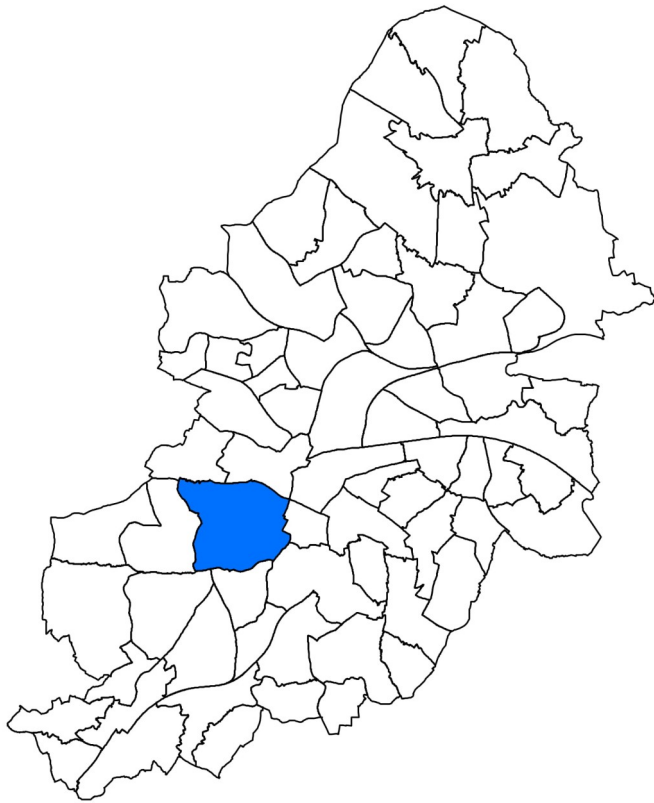


Edgbaston Ward Factsheet

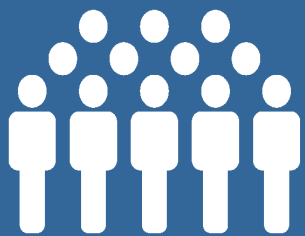


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Edgbaston is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 18,260 making it the 30th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a very high proportion of young adults (18-24) due to a large student population. The area has a similar ethnic profile to Birmingham as a whole.

Edgbaston is amongst the least deprived wards in the city but the high proportion of students living in the ward impacts on employment rates in the ward and suppresses average income levels.

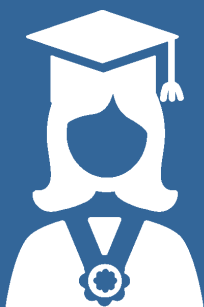

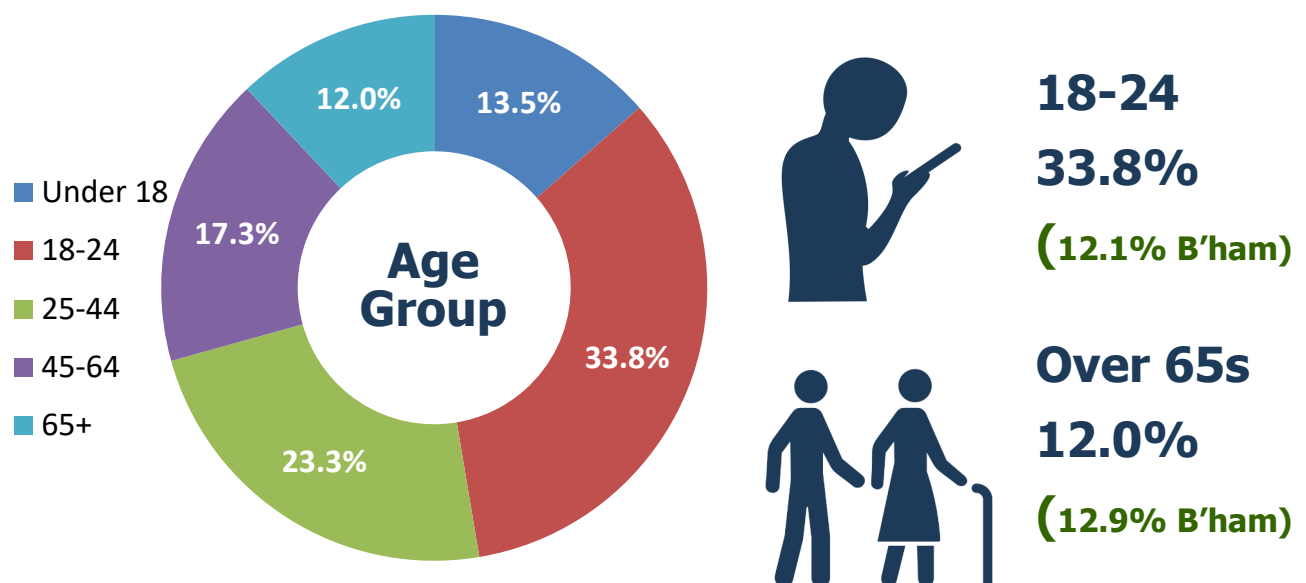

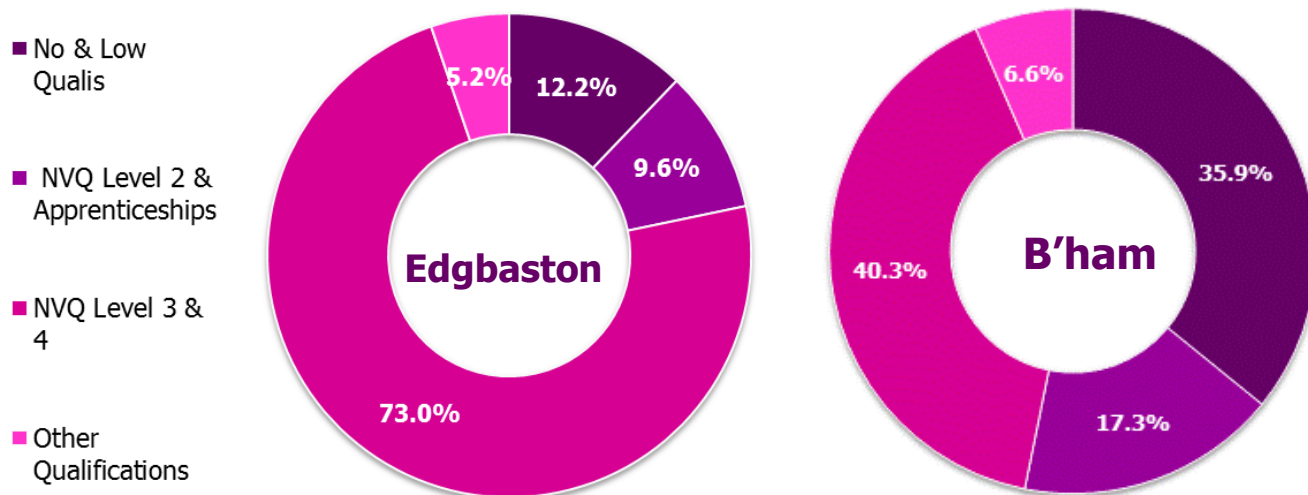
