


Erdington Ward Factsheet



Erdington is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 21,552 making it the 19th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Erdington is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation levels and has the 41st highest share of residents with no qualifications.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are similar to the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,429 children living in low income households in Erdington, 26.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 51st in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Erdington stood at £2621m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £12,640. Erdington has the 24th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
