
Hall Green North Ward Factsheet



Hall Green North is a suburban ward located in the south east of the city. It has a population of 24,550 making it the 5th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a higher BAME population share.

Hall Green North is less deprived than the majority of the city's 69 wards and has a lower share of residents with no qualifications than the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are a little above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 2,915 children living in low income households in Hall Green North, 38.5% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 25th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Hall Green North stood at £204m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £8,811. Hall Green North has the 30th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
