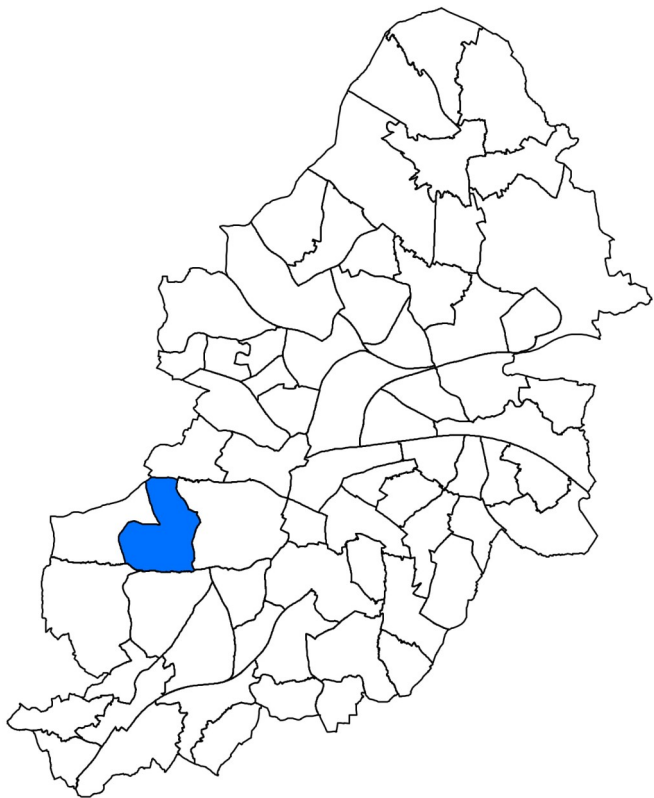


Harborne Ward Factsheet

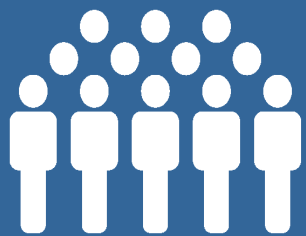


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Harborne is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 21,856 making it the 11th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a smaller share of the population from BAME backgrounds.

Harborne is amongst the least deprived wards in the city and has the 6th highest average income amongst the city's 69 wards. Resident employment rates are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below those for Birmingham as a whole.

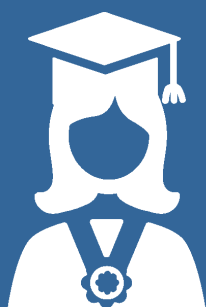

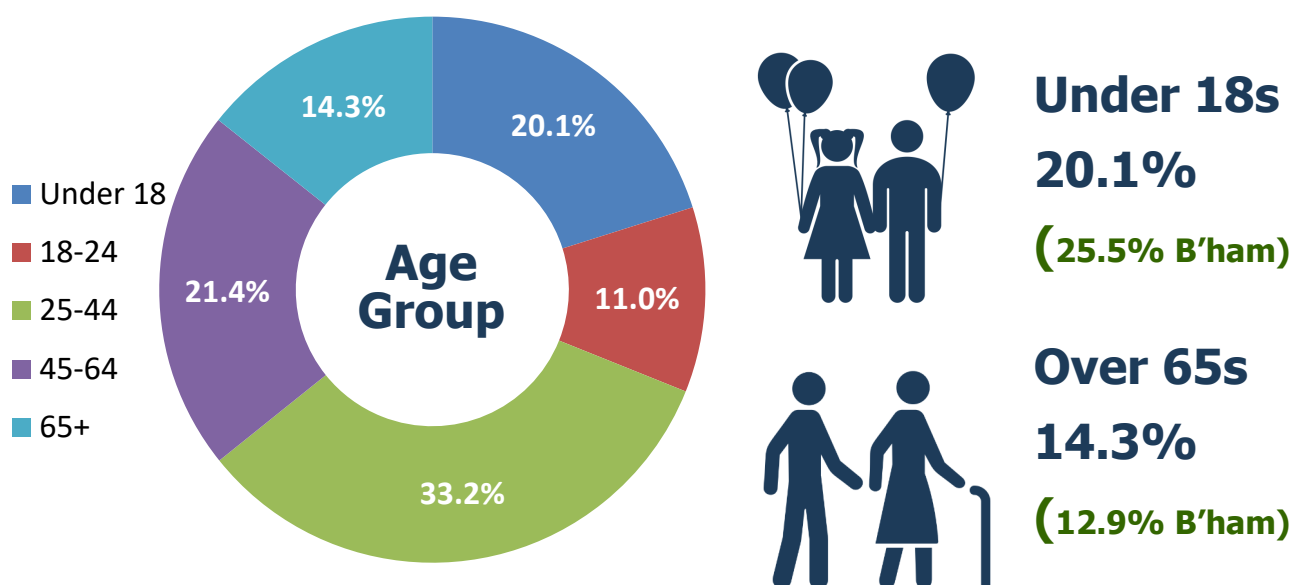

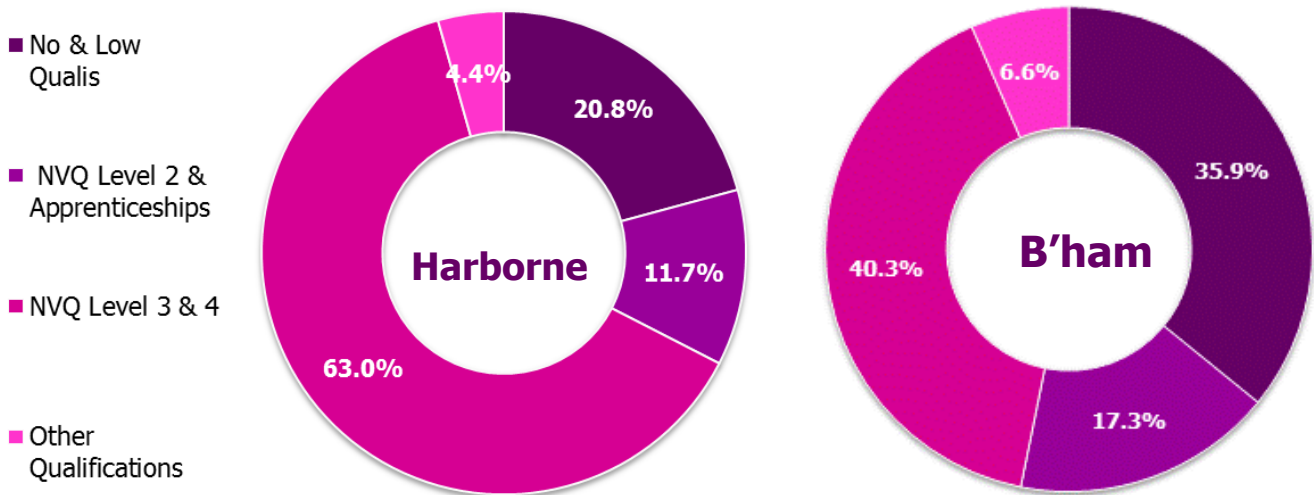

The following are average income figures for individuals (16+) not household income. They are estimates based on an experimental dataset produced by the ONS based on administrative data from Pay As You Earn (PAYE) employment and pension data, tax credits data and Child Benefit data from HM Revenue and Customs and benefits data from the Department for Work and Pensions.
