Harborne Ward Factsheet



Harborne Ward is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 23,003 making it the 11th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a smaller share of the population from BANE backgrounds.

Harborne is amongst the least deprived wards in the city and has a higher share of working age residents with NVQ4+ qualifications than the Birmingham average.

Resident employment rates are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below those for Birmingham as a whole.





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Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,195 children living in low income households in Harborne, 21.9% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 56th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Harborne stood at £697m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £28,100. Harborne has the 7th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
