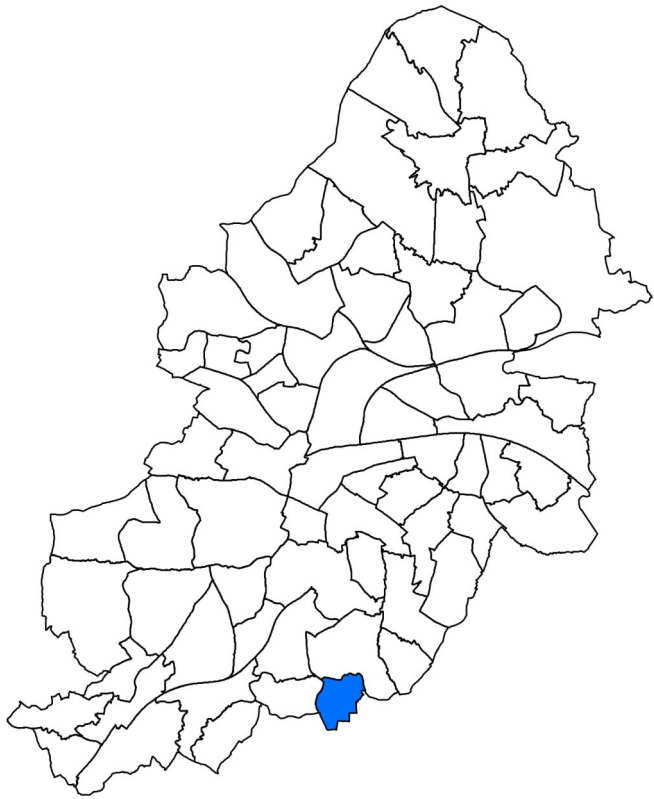


Highter's Heath Ward Factsheet



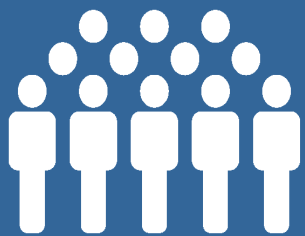
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Highter's Heath is an outer city ward located in the south of the city. It has a population of 11,182 making it the 48th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Highter's Heath is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards in terms of deprivation and average income.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.

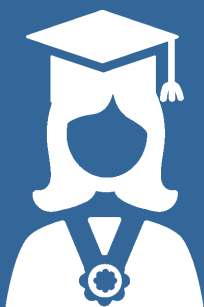

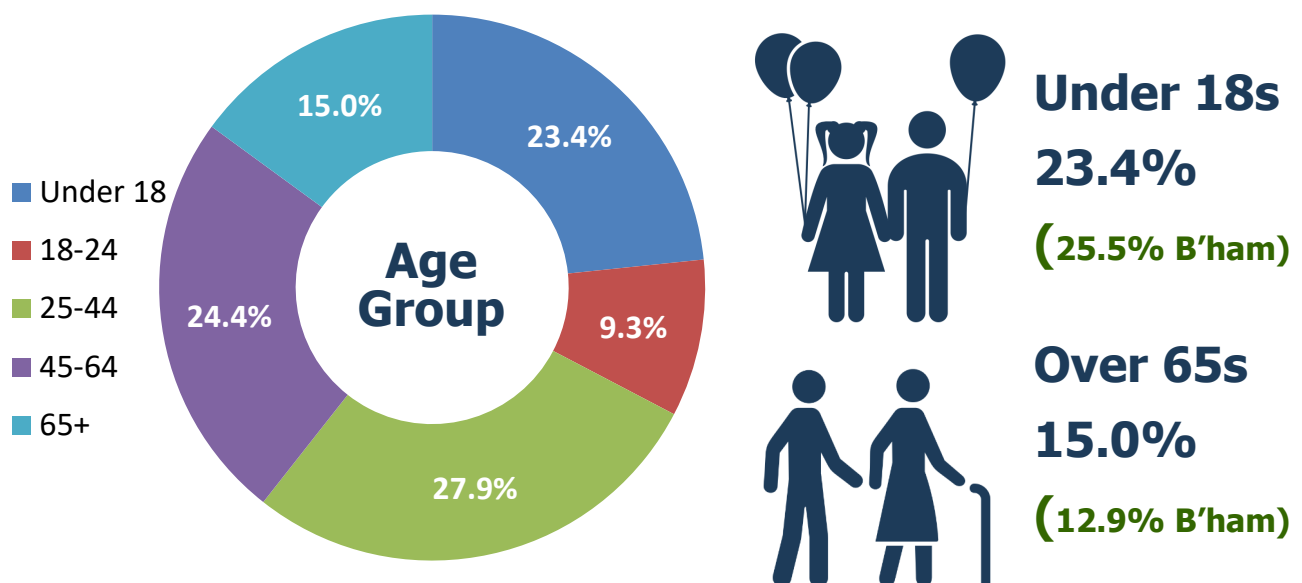

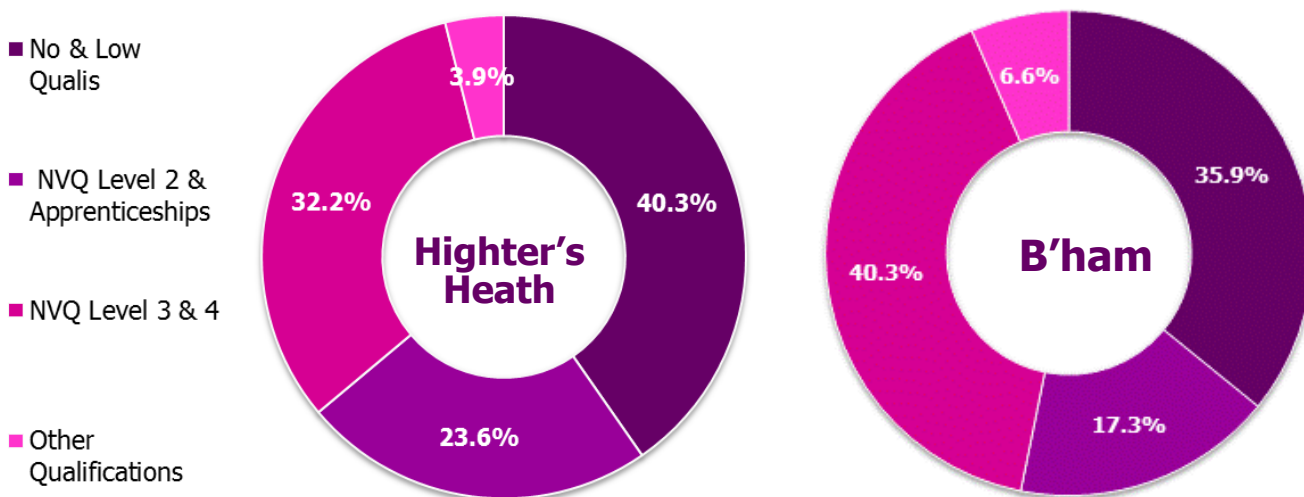
