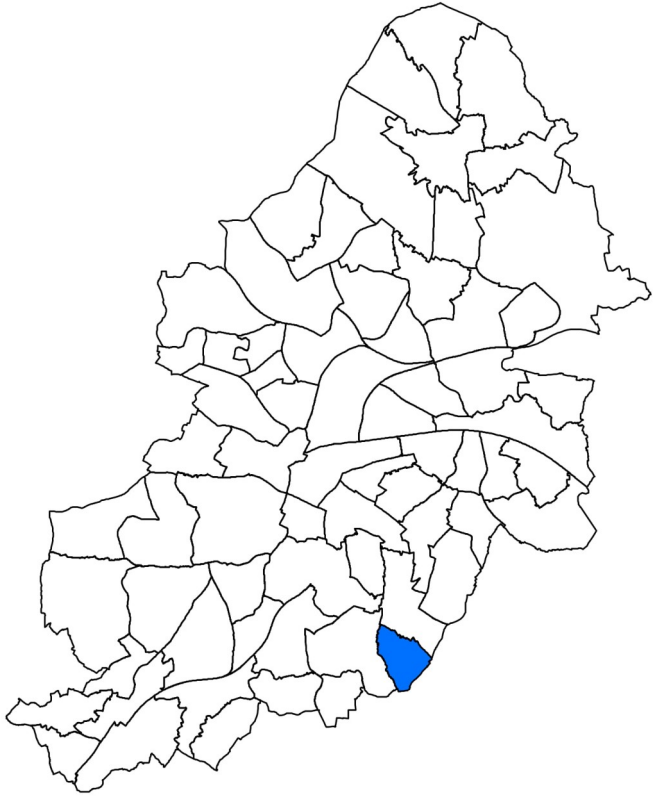


Hall Green South Ward Factsheet



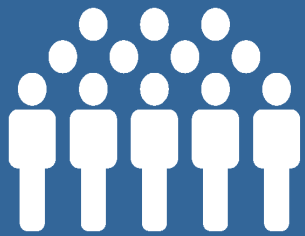

Hall Green South is a suburban ward located in the south east of the city. It has a population of 10,420 making it the 56th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a slightly lower BAME population share.

Hall Green South is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has average income levels well above the Birmingham average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.

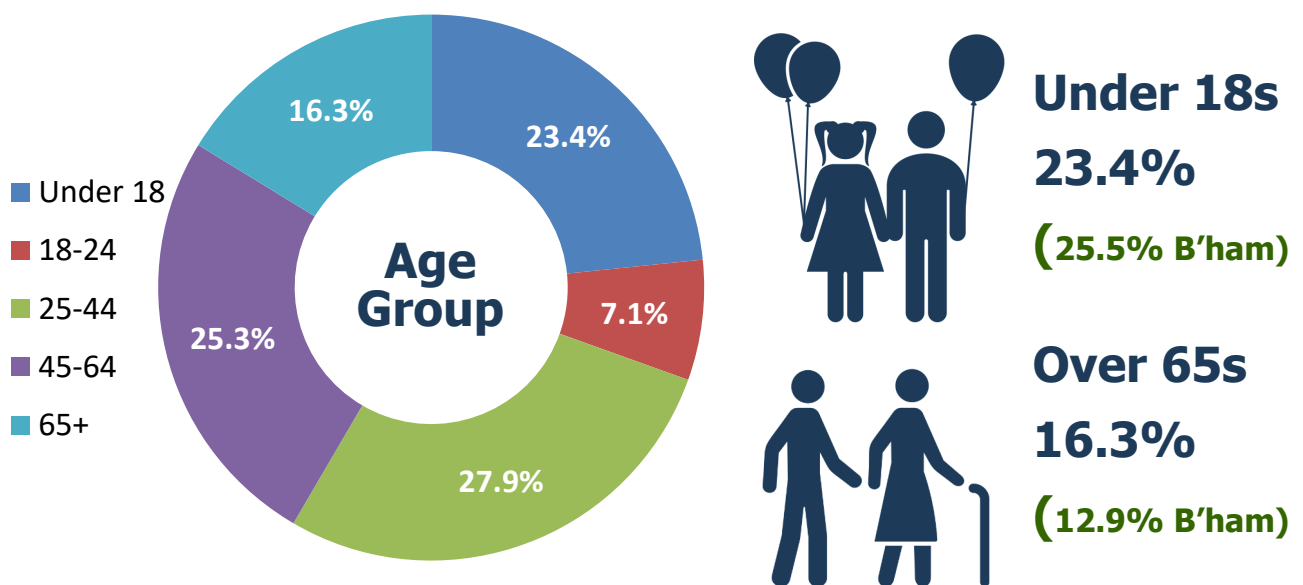

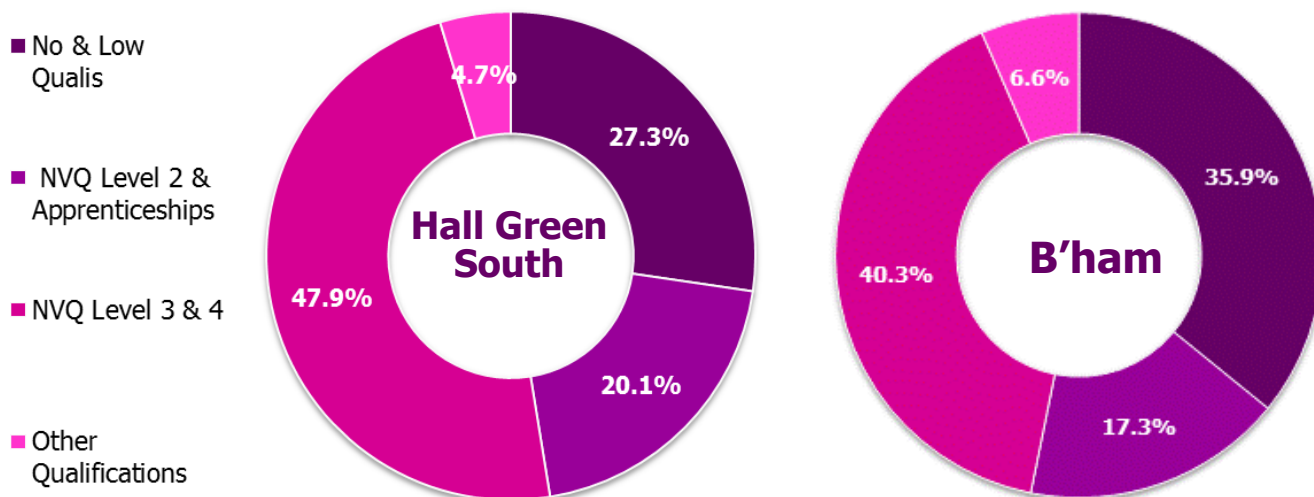

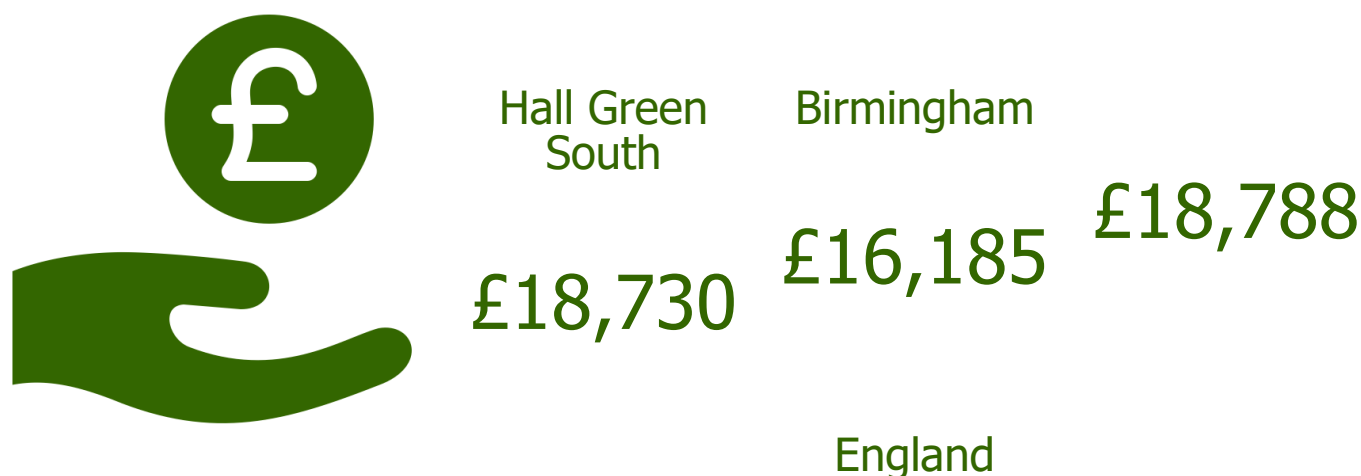
