Hall Green South Ward Factsheet



Hall Green South is a suburban ward located in the south east of the city. It has a population of 10,987 making it the 57th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a slightly lower BAME population share.

Hall Green South is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has a higher share of residents qualified to NVQ4+ level than the city as a whole.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 559 children living in low income households in Hall Green South, 19.5% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 57th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Hall Green South stood at £51m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £4,988. Hall Green South has the 67th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
