Handsworth Ward Factsheet



Handsworth is an inner city ward located to the north west of the city centre. It has a population of 11,814 making it the 47th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Handsworth is amongst the more deprived wards in the city and has the 6th highest share of residents with no qualifications of the 69 wards in the city.

Resident employment rates in the ward are much lower than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.



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

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,930 children living in low income households in Handsworth, 52.4% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 11th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Handsworth stood at £80m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £6,357. Handsworth has the 62^{nd} largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
