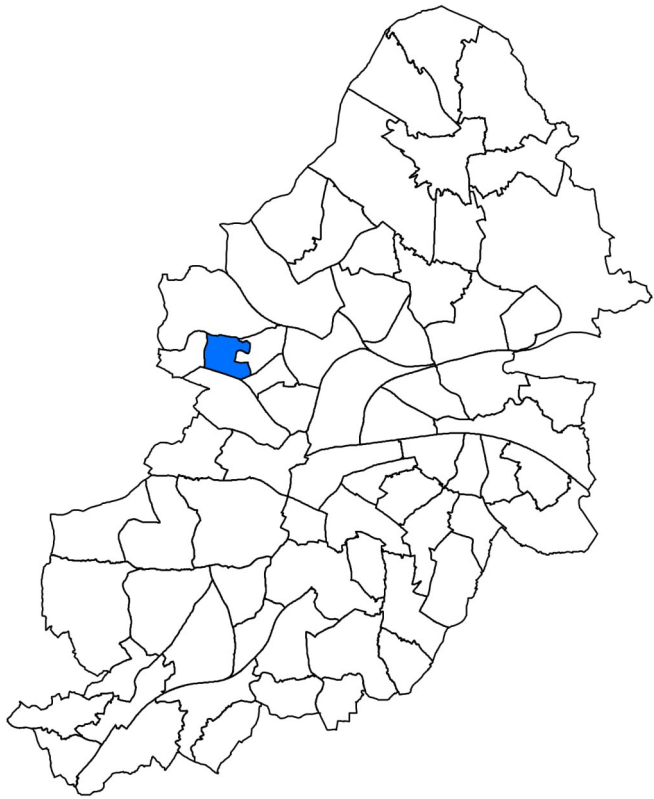


Handsworth Ward Factsheet

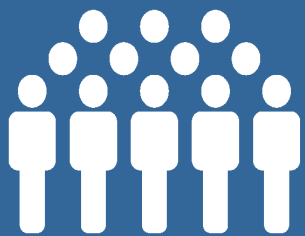


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Handsworth Ward is an inner city ward located to the north west of the city centre. It has a population of 11,733 making it the 40th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Handsworth is amongst the more deprived wards in the city and has the 12th lowest average income out of the 69 wards in the city. Resident employment rates in the ward are much lower than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.

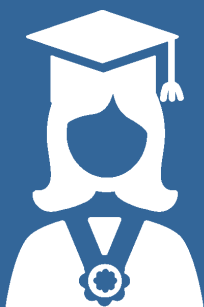

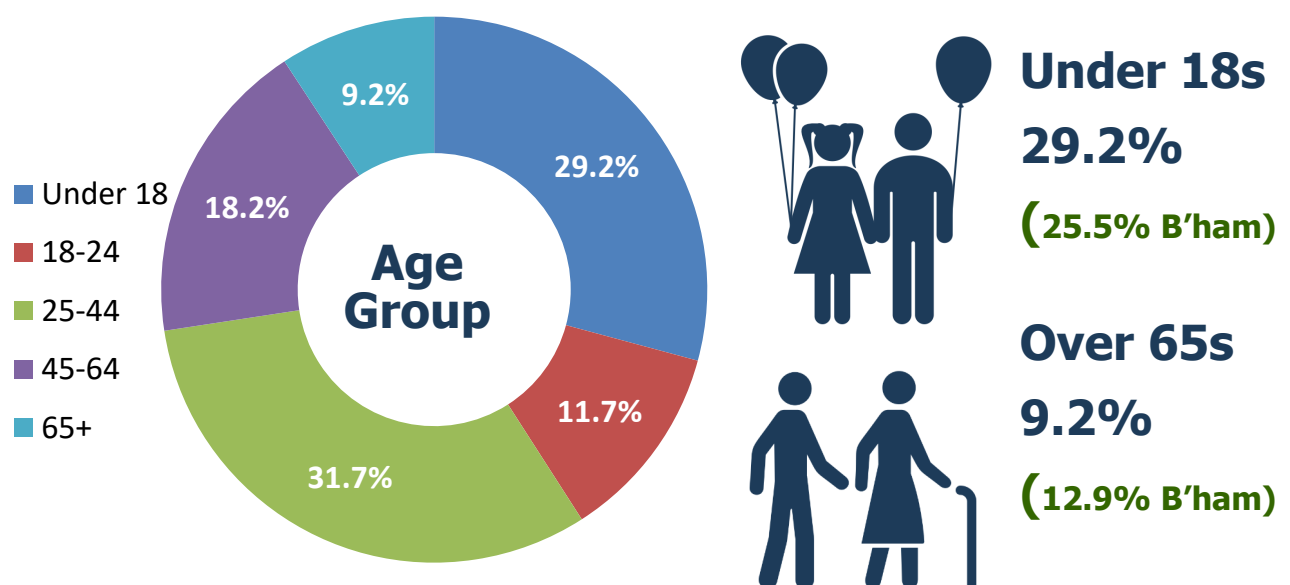

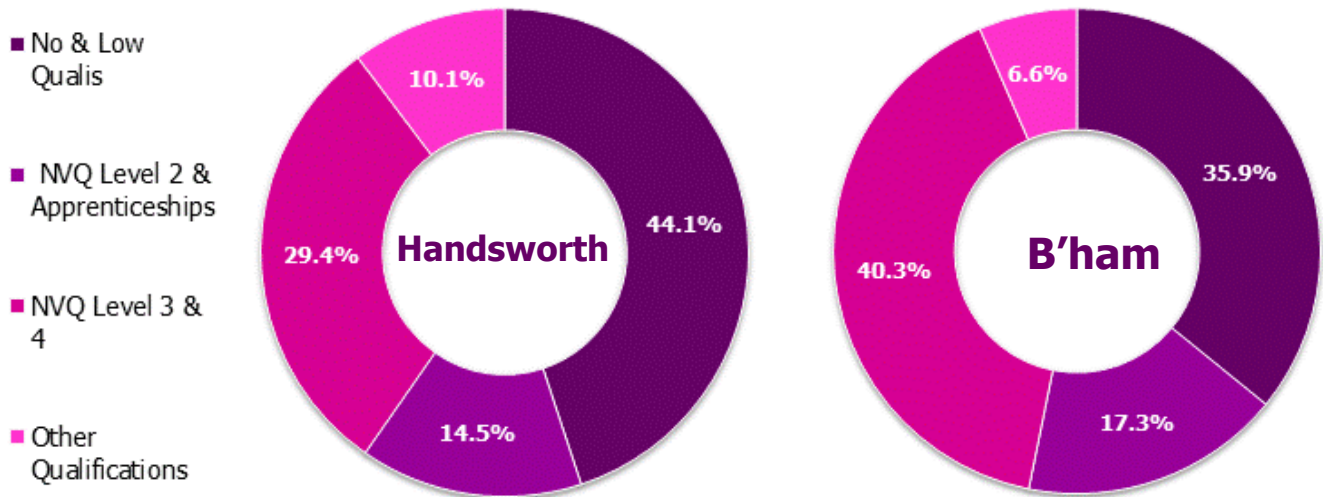
