King's Norton South Ward Factsheet



King's Norton South Ward is located in the south of the city. It has a population of 11,583 making it the 51st most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and has a lower BAME population share.

King's Norton South is amongst the more deprived wards in the city and has a significant share of working age residents who are disabled or have long term health condition.

Resident employment rates in the ward are a little above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are higher than the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,128 children living in low income households in King's Norton South, 32.8% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 35th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in King's Norton South stood at £134m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £11,994. King's Norton South has the 43rd largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
