The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and has a lower BAME population share.

King's Norton North is amongst the less deprived wards in the city.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are lower than the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 712 children living in low income households in King's Norton North, 23.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 55th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.





Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in King's Norton North stood at £258m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £22,144. King's Norton North has the 25th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
