## **Oscott Ward Factsheet**



Oscott is a suburban ward located in the north west of the city. It has a population of 20,567 making it the 25<sup>th</sup> most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Oscott is one of the less deprived wards in the city and has lower levels of child poverty than the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below the Birmingham average.





### **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,434 children living in low income households in Oscott,26.1% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked  $50^{th}$  in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

### **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Oscott stood at £192m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £9,534. Oscott has the 32<sup>nd</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
