Northfield Ward Factsheet



Northfield is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 10,406 making it the 61st most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Northfield is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has a lower share of working age residents with no qualifications than the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.





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Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 373 children living in low income households in Northfield, 16.0% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 59th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Northfield stood at £149m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £14,712. Northfield has the 40th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
