Newtown Ward Factsheet



Newtown Ward is an inner city ward located to the north west of the city centre. It has a population of 16,289 making it the 33rd most populous wad in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Newtown is one of the most deprived wards in the city.

Resident employment rates in the ward are much lower than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 2,820 children living in low income households in Newtown, 45.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 19^{th} in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Newtown stood at £11.1bn in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £71,127. Newtown has the 5th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
