# **Moseley Ward Factsheet**



Moseley is a suburban ward located in the south of the city. It has a population of 21,845 making it the  $17^{th}$  most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a similar share of the population from a BANE background.

Moseley is amongst the least deprived wards in the city and has the a much larger share of working age residents educated to NVQ4+ level than the Birmingham average.

Resident employment rates are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below those for Birmingham as a whole.





# **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,516 children living in low income households in Moseley, 31.6% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 40<sup>th</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



# **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Moseley stood at £207m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £9,545. Moseley has the 27<sup>th</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.



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
