# **Pype Hayes Ward Factsheet**



Pype Hayes is a suburban ward located in the north east of the city. It has a population of 11,063 making it the  $55^{th}$  most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a higher BAME population share.

Pype Hayes is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivat6ion and child poverty rates.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.







## **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 836 children living in low income households in Pype Hayes, 28.4% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 46<sup>th</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



#### **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Pype Hayes stood at £554m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £51,222. Pype Hayes has the 12<sup>th</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
