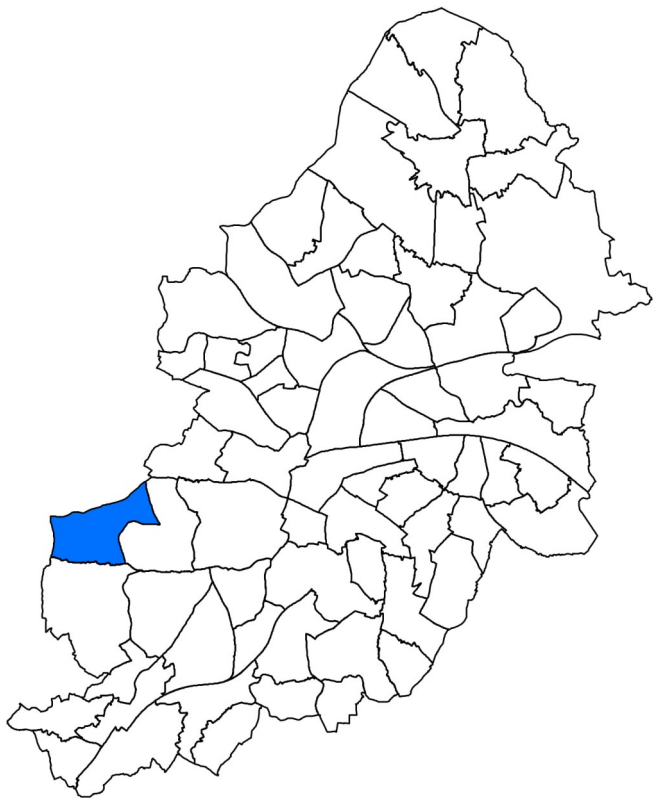


Quinton Ward Factsheet



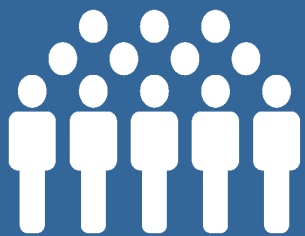
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Quinton is a suburban ward located in the west of the city. It has a population of 20,251 making it the 20th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Quinton is one of the better performing wards in the city for average income and is amongst the least deprived wards in the city.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average.

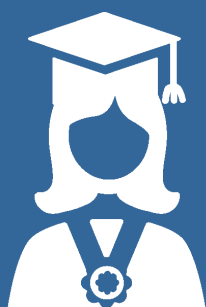

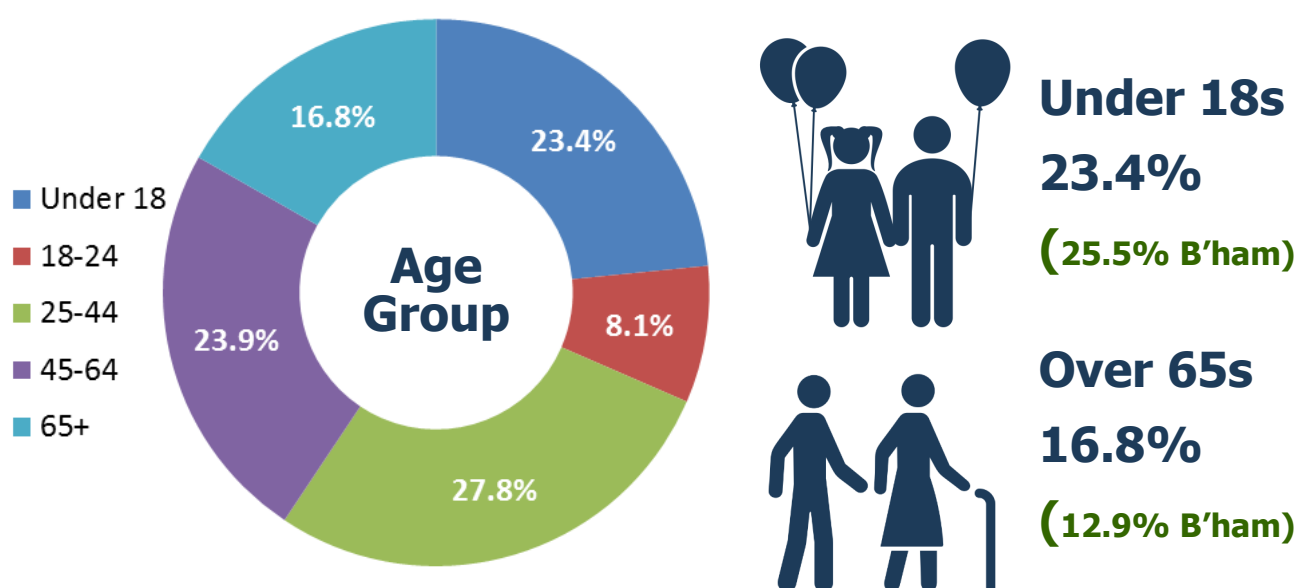
