

Stockland Green Ward Factsheet



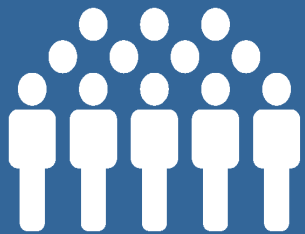
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Stockland Green is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 21,572 making it the 13th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a slightly higher BAME population share.

Stockland Green is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation levels and average income.

Resident employment rates in the ward are above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

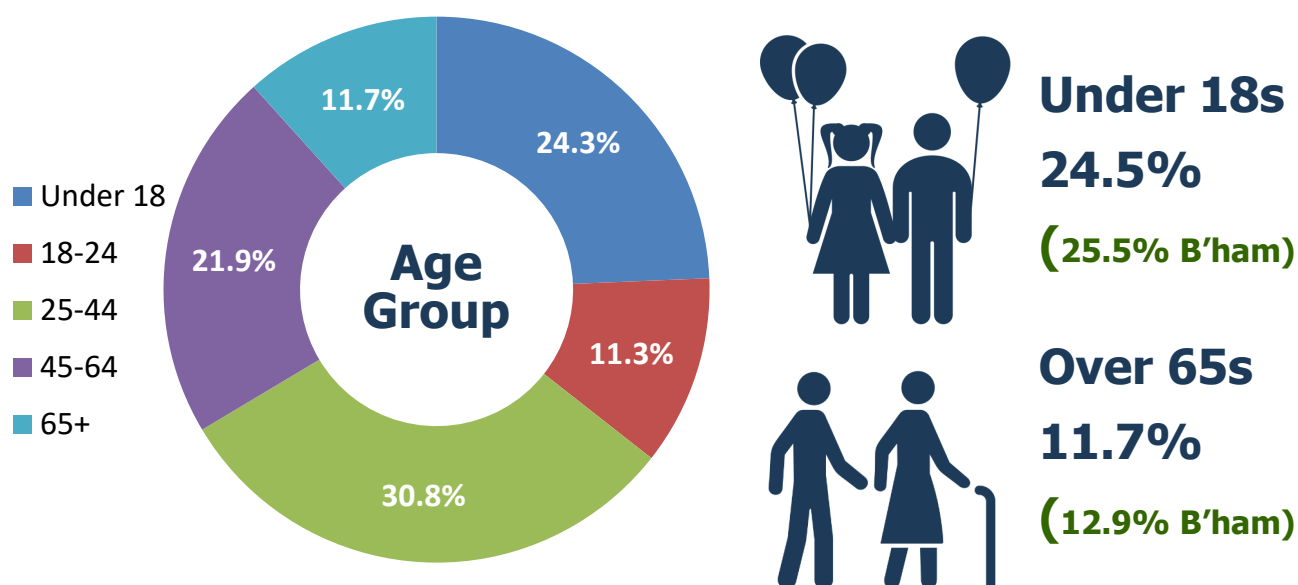

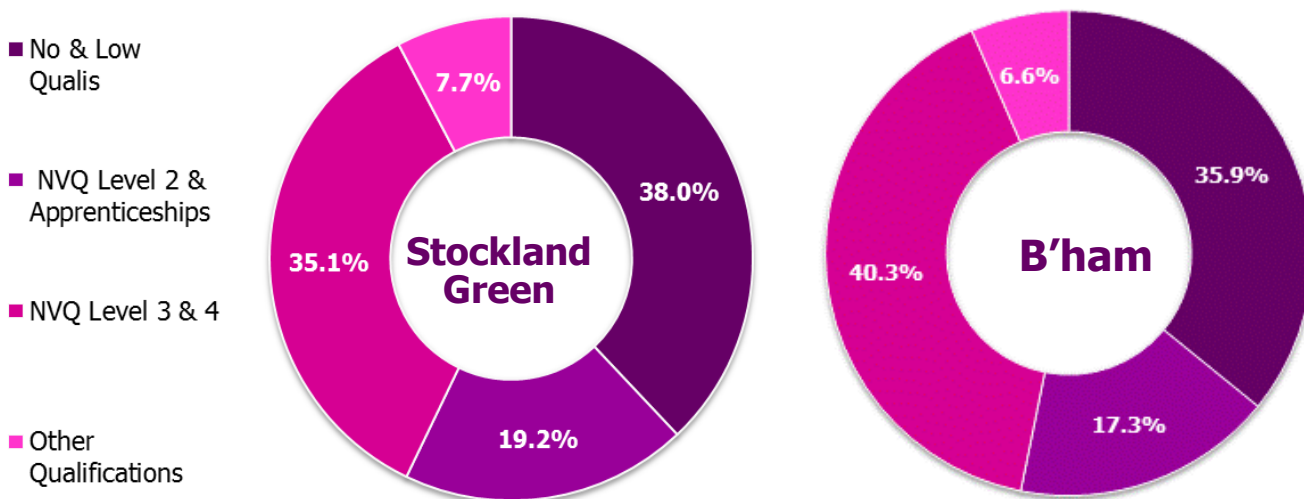

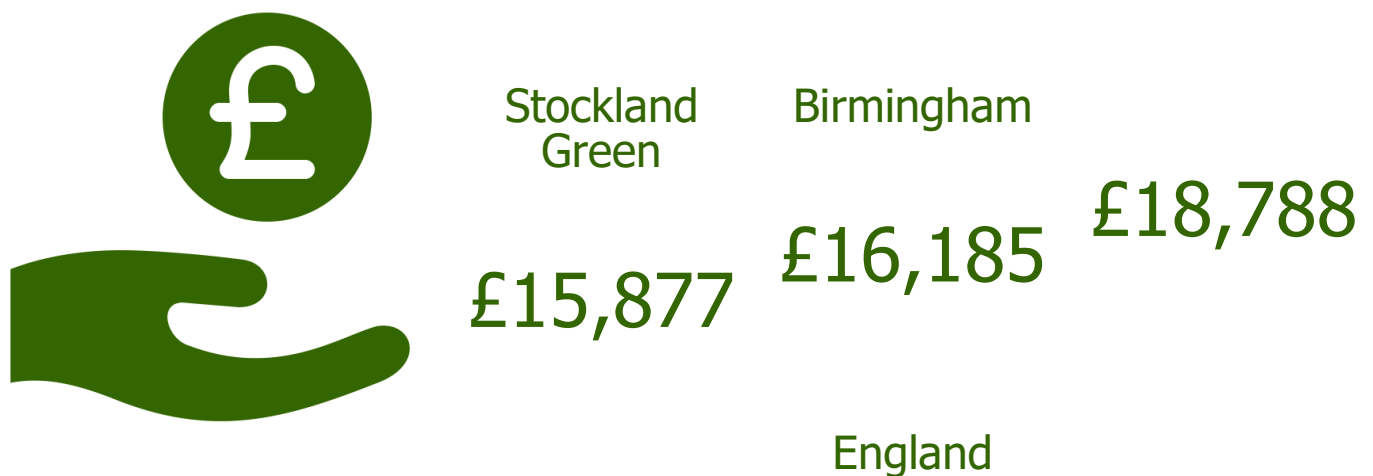
