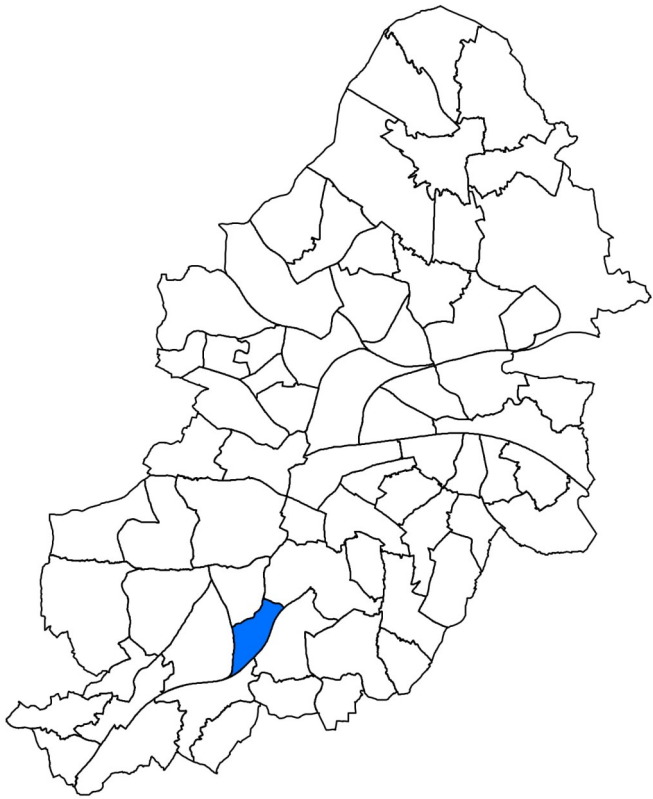


Stirchley Ward Factsheet



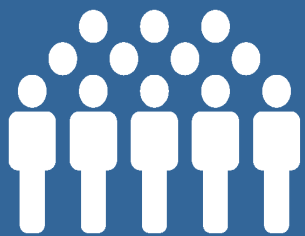
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Stirchley is a suburban ward located in the south of the city. It has a population of 9,932 making it the 8th smallest ward in terms of population.

The ward has a broadly similar age profile to the city but has fewer young people and more aged 25-44. The area has a lower BAME population share than the city.

Stirchley is lower ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation and has average income levels above the Birmingham Average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are below the Birmingham average..

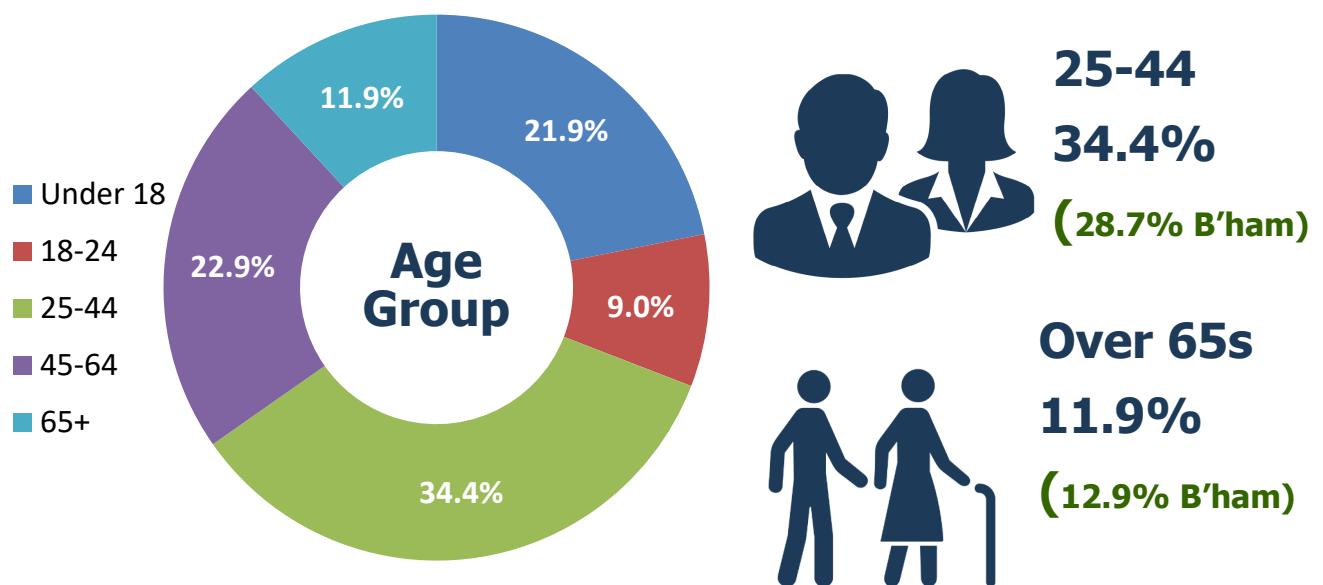

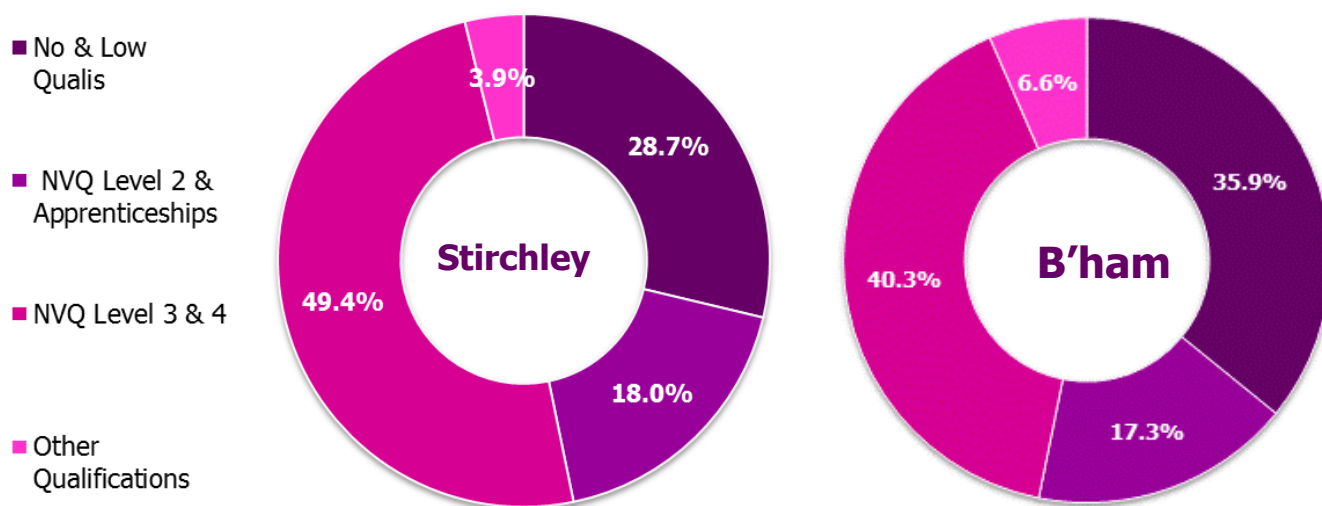

Average Income 2016

The following are average income figures for individuals (16+) not household income. They are estimates based on an experimental dataset produced by the ONS based on administrative data from Pay As You Earn (PAYE) employment and pension data, tax credits data and Child Benefit data from HM Revenue and Customs and benefits data from the Department for Work and Pensions.



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
