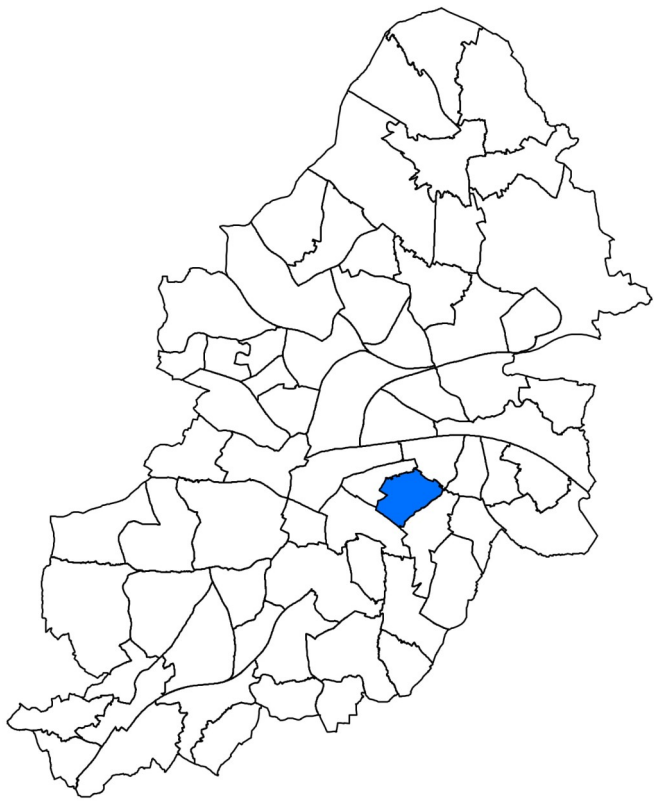


Small Heath Ward Factsheet



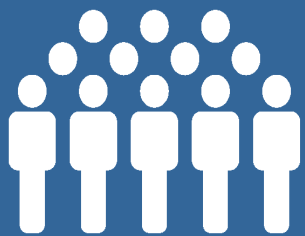
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Small Heath ward is an inner city ward located to the south east of the city centre. It has a population of 20,403 making it the 18th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Small Heath is amongst the more deprived wards in the city and has the 4th lowest average income.

Resident employment rates in the ward are much lower than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are similar to the Birmingham average.

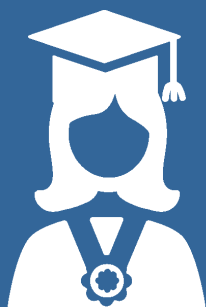

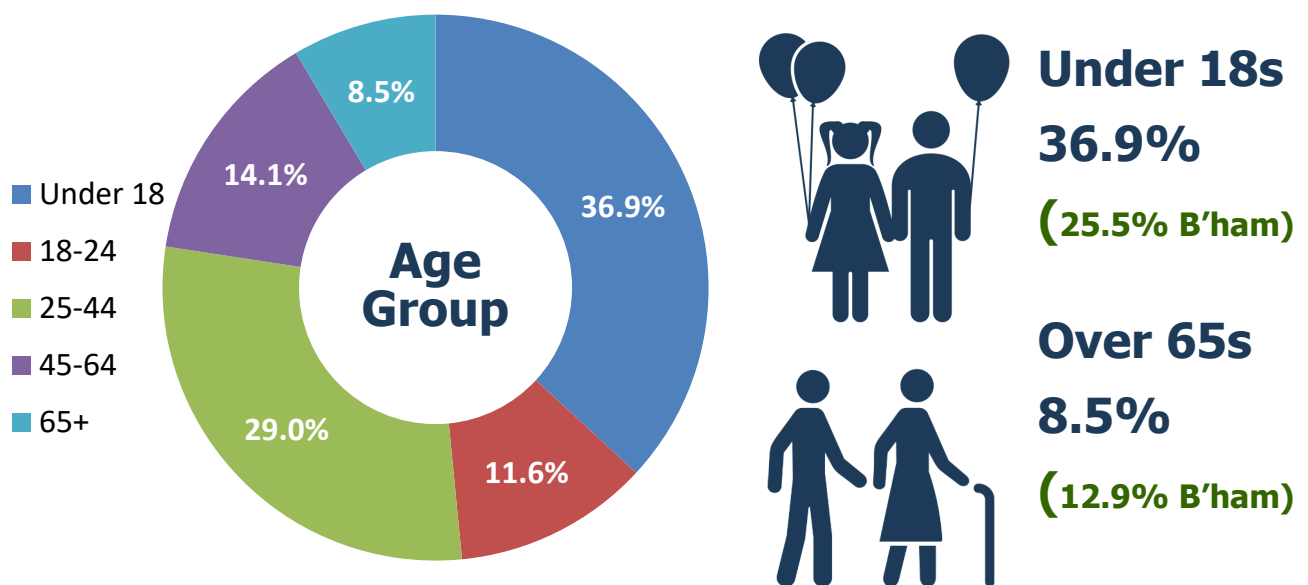

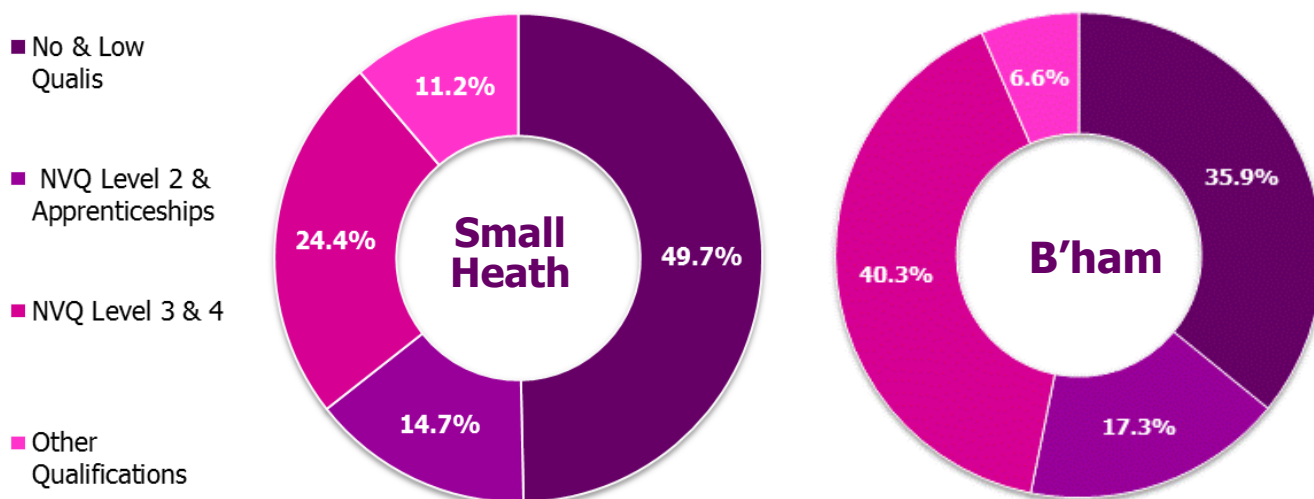
