Sparkhill Ward Factsheet



Sparkhill ward is located in the inner city to the south east of the city centre. It has a population of 21,464 making it the 20th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Sparkhill is mid ranking amongst the city's wards in relation to deprivation levels but has the 6th highest child poverty rate out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.





Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 4,353 children living in low income households in Sparkhill, 59.3% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 6th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Sparkhill stood at £128m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £5,944. Sparkhill has the 17th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
