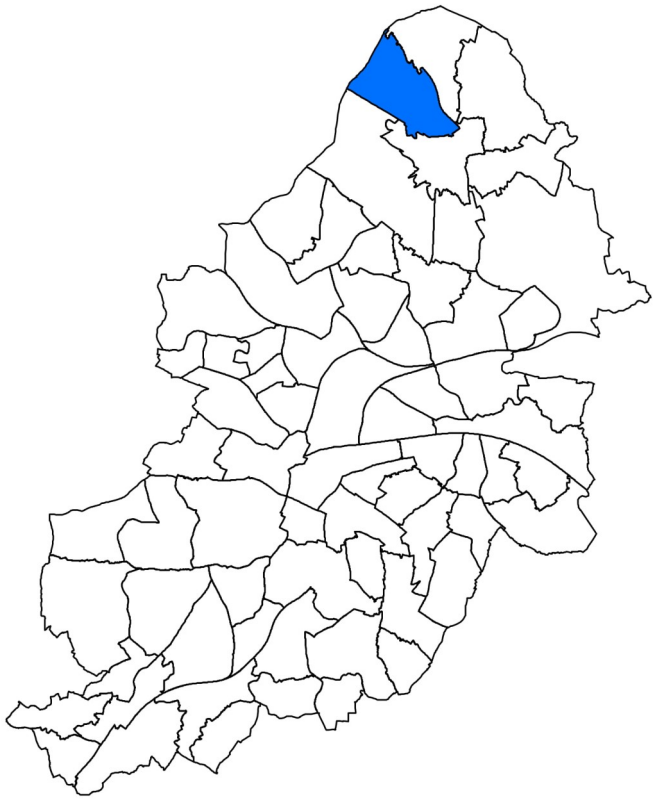


Sutton Four Oaks Ward Factsheet



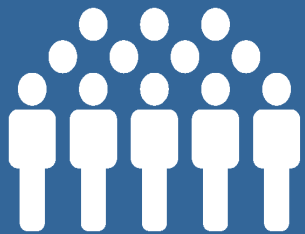

Sutton Four Oaks is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 9,019 making it the 3rd smallest ward in the city in terms of population.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Sutton Four Oaks is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has the highest average income levels out of the 69 Birmingham wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below the Birmingham average.

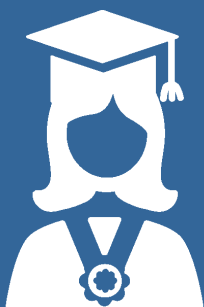

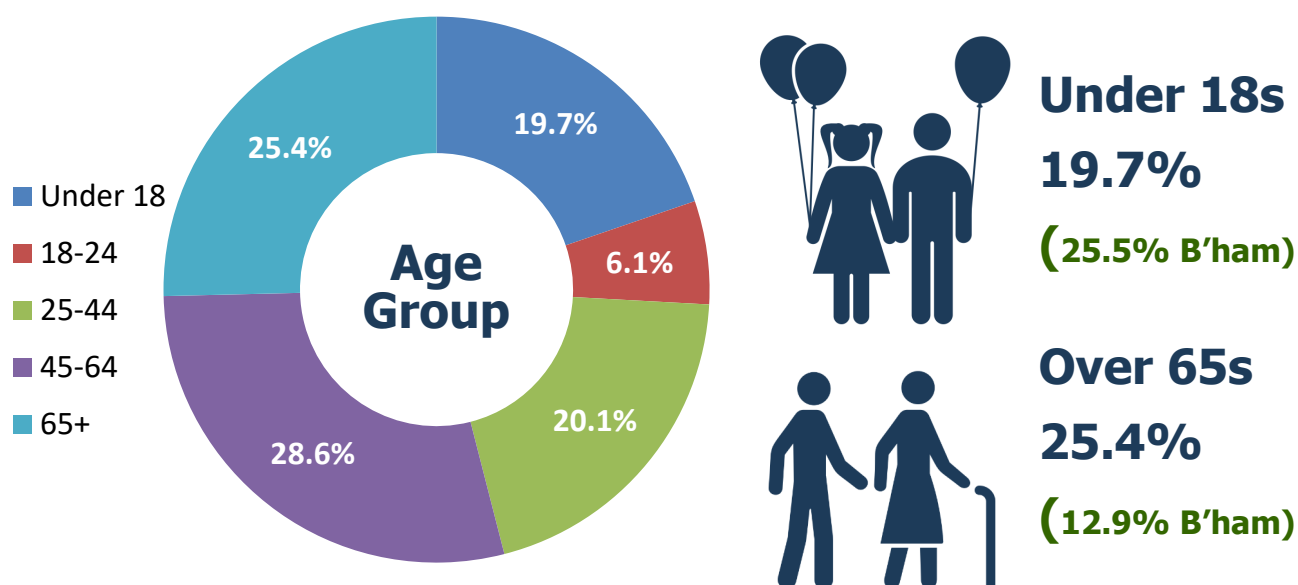

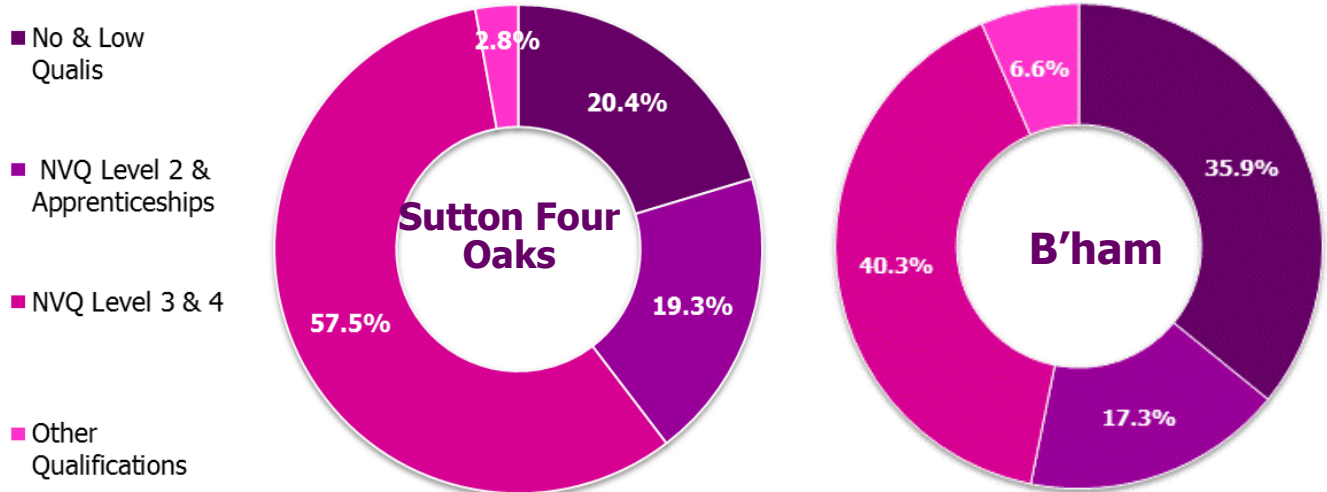
