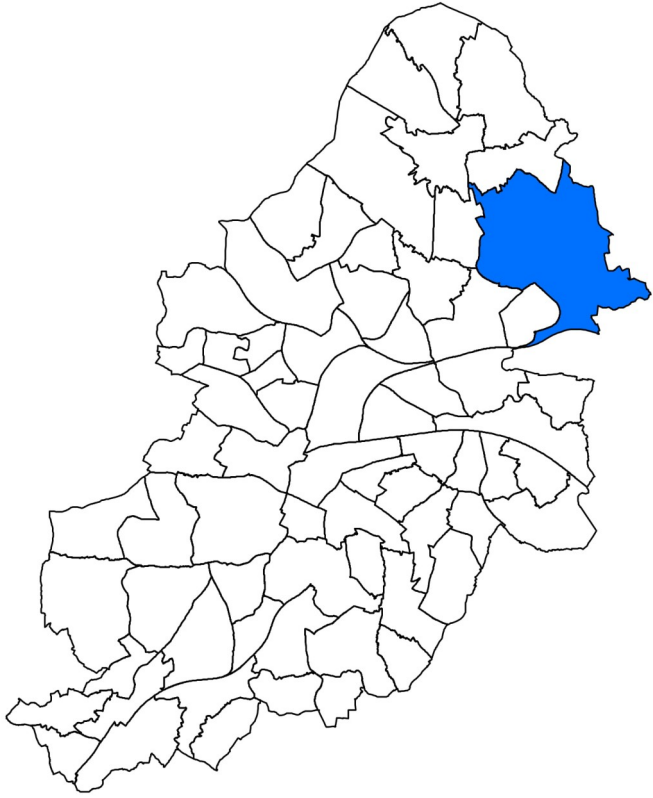


Sutton Walmley & Minworth Ward Factsheet



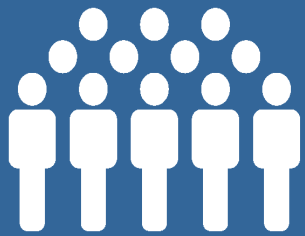
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Sutton Walmley & Minworth is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 16,437 making it the 32nd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Sutton Walmley & Minworth is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has the 8th highest average income levels out of the 69 Birmingham wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below the Birmingham average.

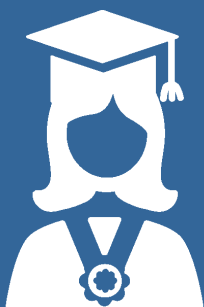

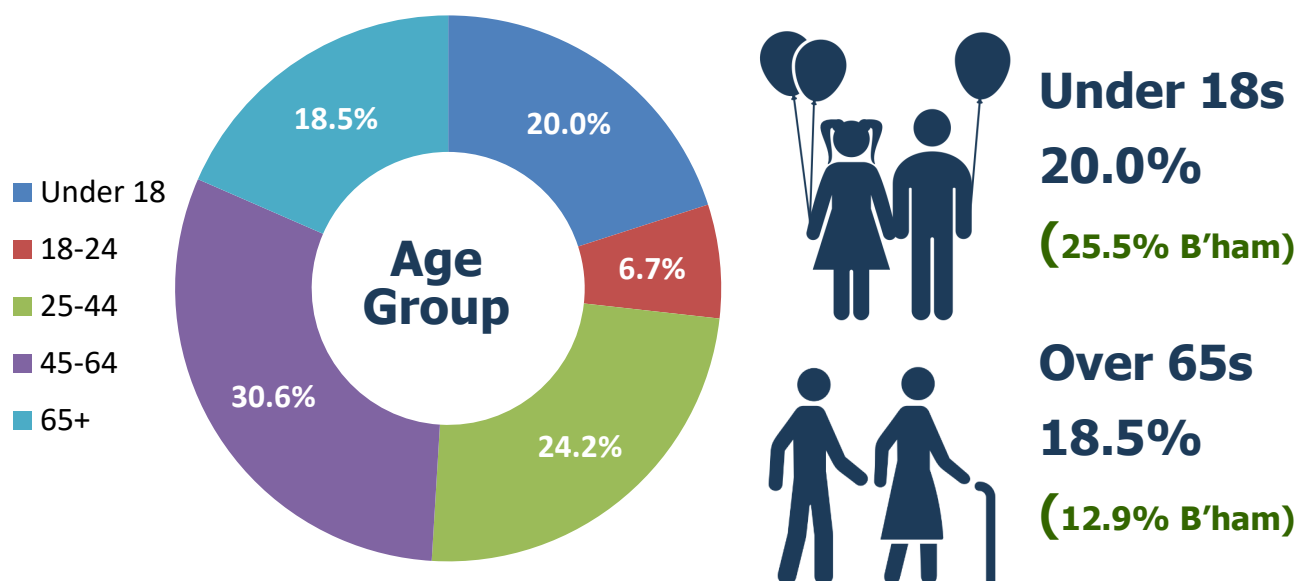

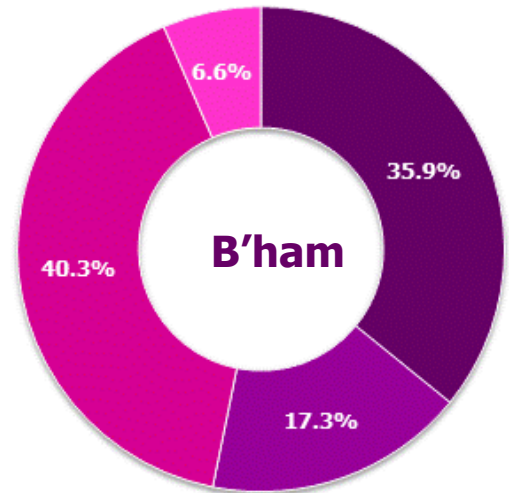
