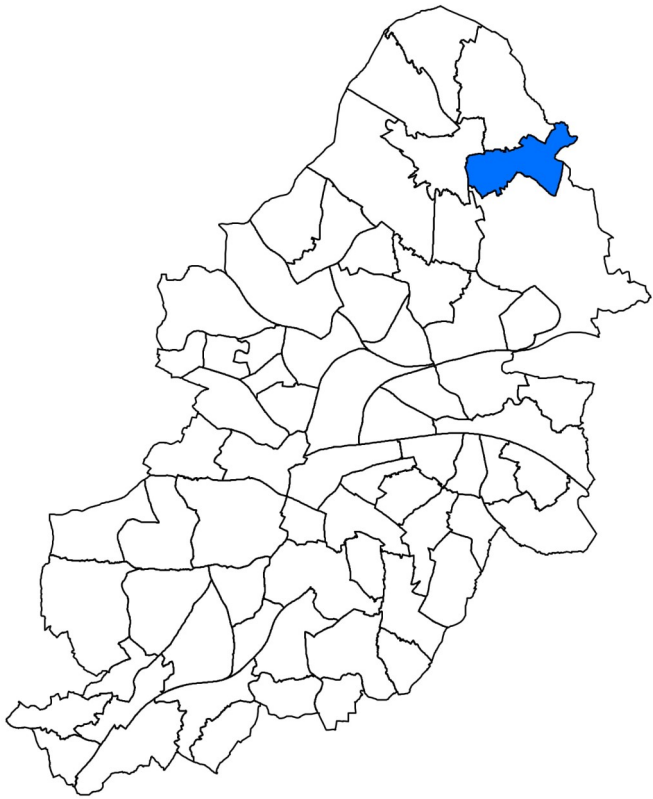


Sutton Reddicap Ward Factsheet



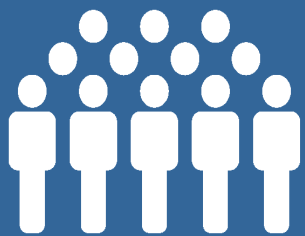
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Sutton Reddicap is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 10,170 making it the 11th smallest ward in the city in terms of population.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Sutton Reddicap is one of the least deprived wards in the city and has the 11th highest average income levels out of the 69 Birmingham wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below the Birmingham average.

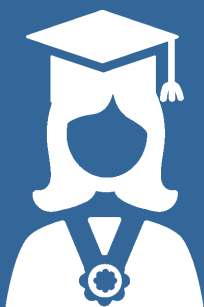

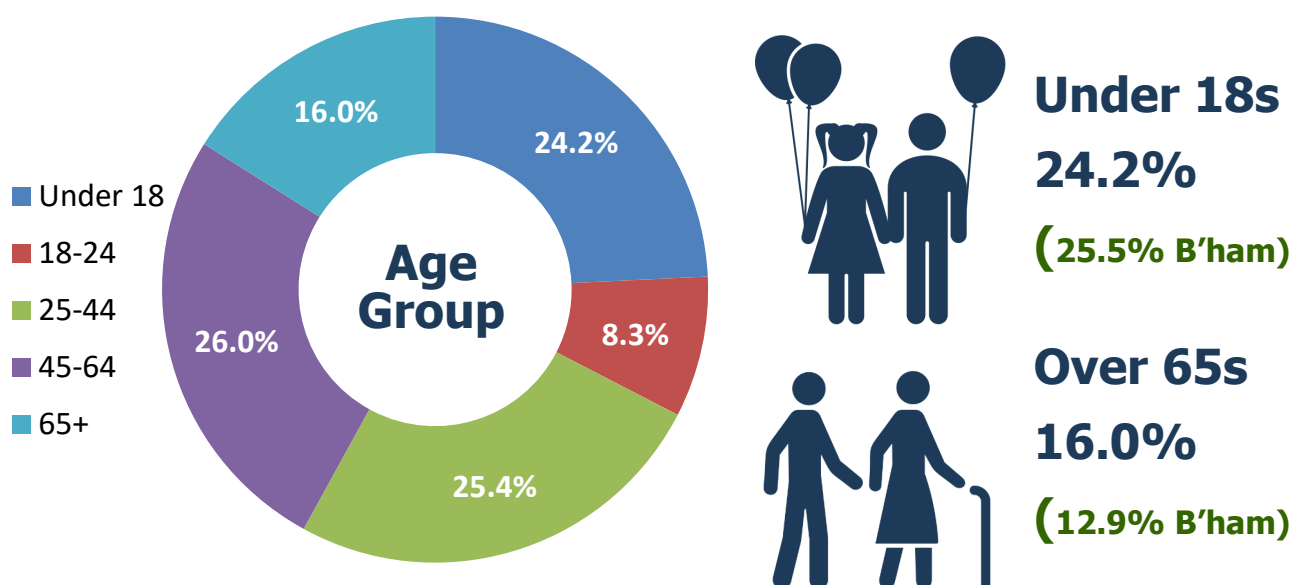

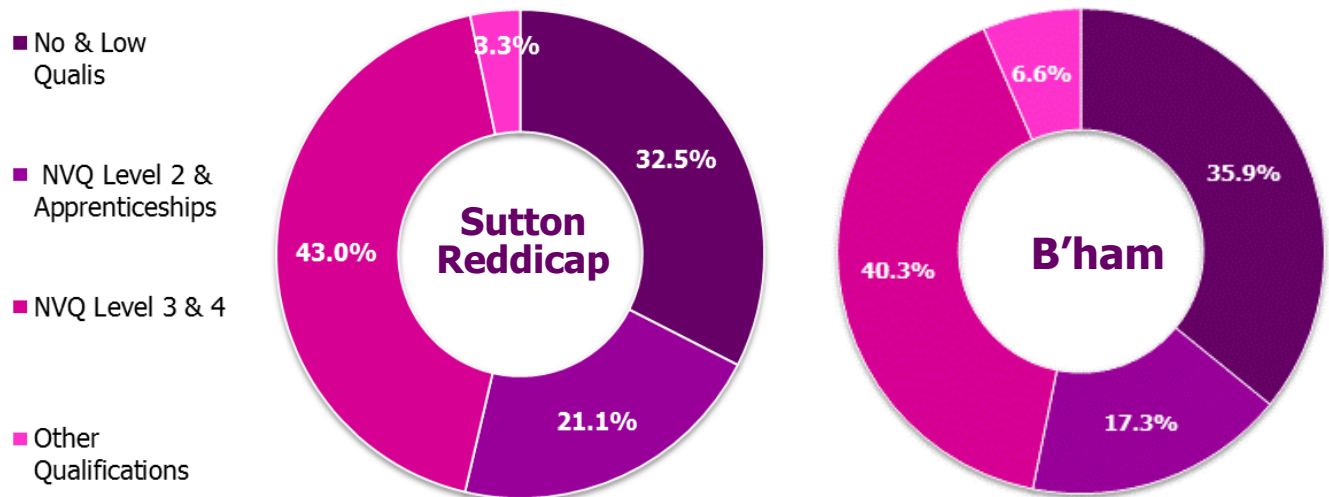
