# Ward End Ward Factsheet



Ward End is located in the inner city to the east of the city centre. It has a population of 13,717 making it the 36<sup>th</sup> most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a significantly younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Ward End is amongst the city's more deprived wards and has the 4<sup>th</sup> highest level of child poverty amongst the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.







# **Child Poverty**

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 3,203 children living in low income households in Ward End, 60.6% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.



# **Economic Output**

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Ward End stood at £81m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £5,914. Ward End has the 61<sup>st</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.



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
