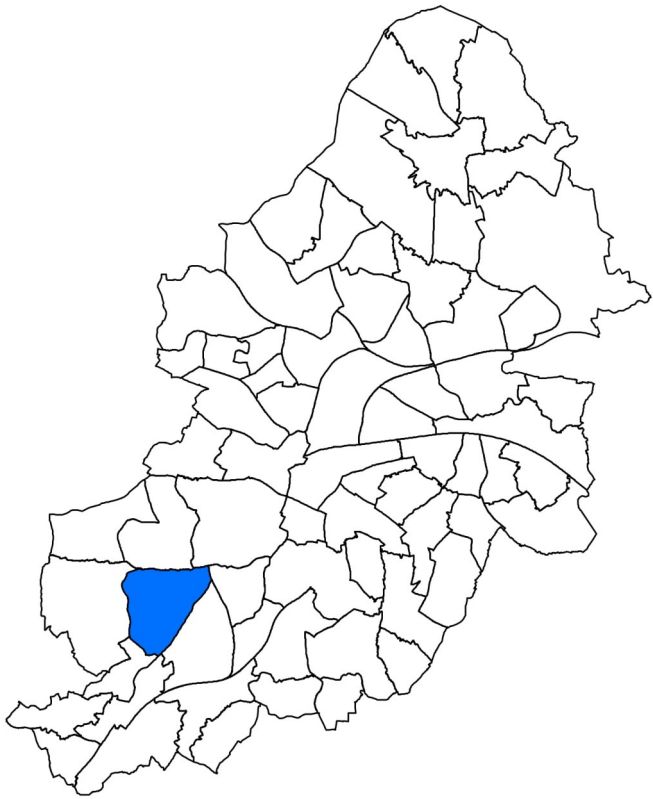


Weoley & Selly Oak Ward Factsheet



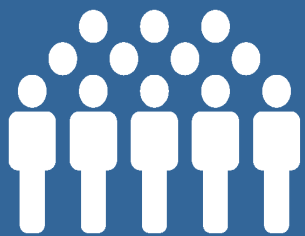

Weoley & Selly Oak is a suburban ward located in the south west of the city. It has a population of 22,290 making it the 5th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Weoley & Selly Oak is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards for deprivation and average income levels.

Resident employment rates in the ward are the same as the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are also similar to the Birmingham average.

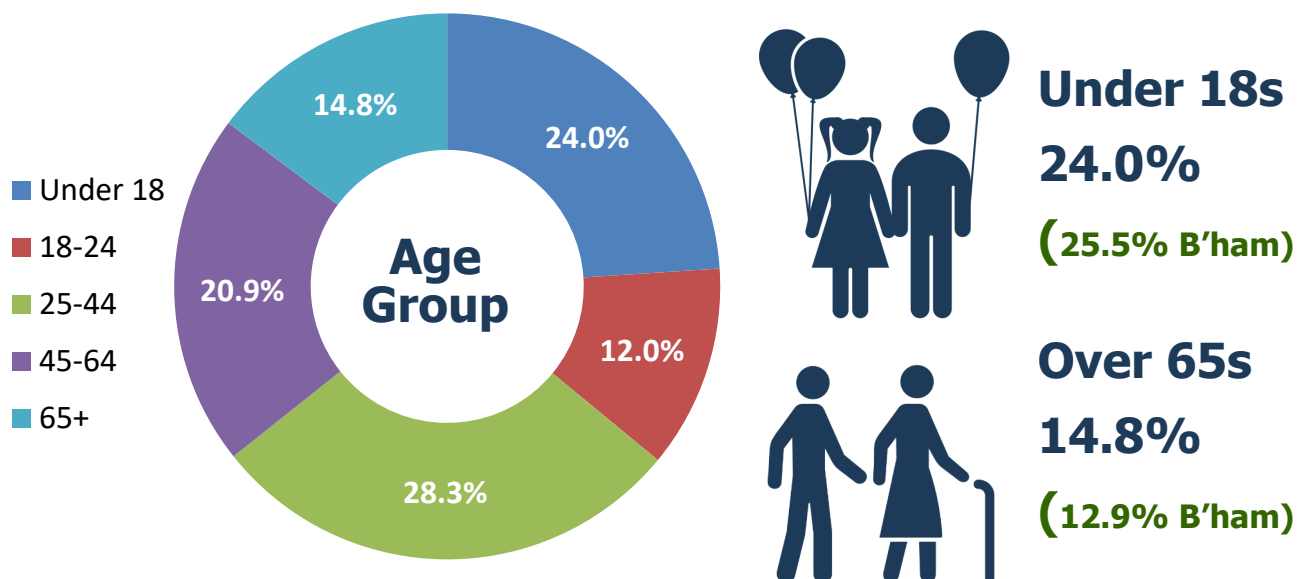

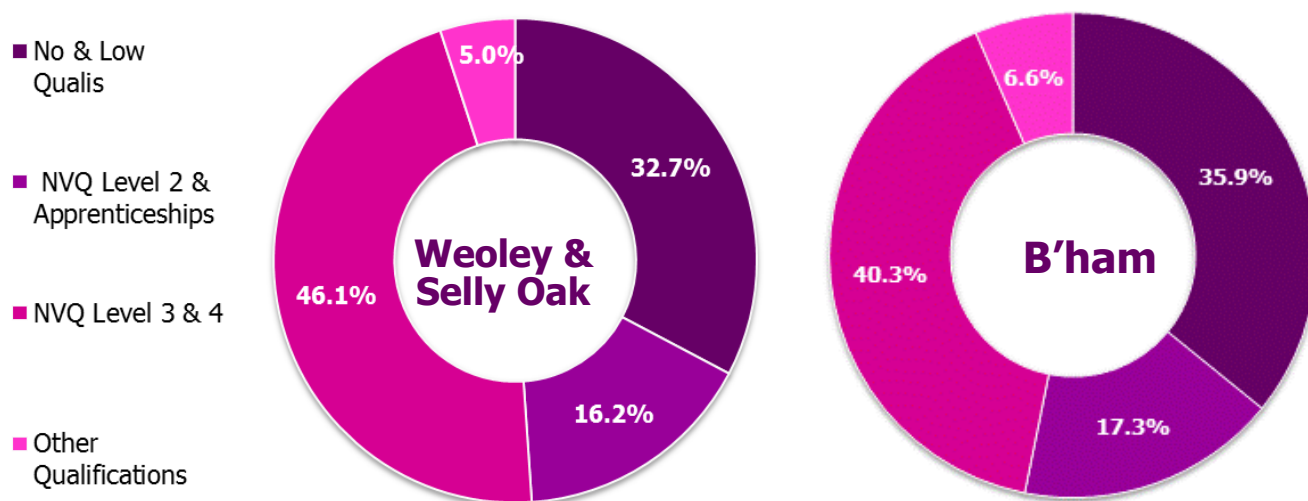
