## Perry Barr A34 Highways Works

## Frequently Asked Questions - May 2020

The following FAQs have been created to provide a more detailed understanding of Phase One of the A34 Highways Works and how these will be managed.

| 1 | When are you starting on the<br>works and how long will these<br>take?           | This first phase of works starts on 8 <sup>th</sup> June and will run through to late 2020.  |
|   |  | The whole works will run through until the end of 2021.  |
| 2 | Why is this work taking place?   | We are carrying out these works as part of the<br>regeneration of Perry Barr, a £500 million-plus<br>programme which includes the delivery of new homes<br>and improvements to public transport infrastructure, as<br>well as the revamping of the Alexander Stadium.  |
| 3 | What roads will be affected by the works?  | The works will mainly affect the A34, A4040 Aston Lane,<br>A4040 Wellington Road, A453 Aldridge Road, Harrier Way<br>and Birchfield Road.  |
| 4 | What do the Phase One works include?   | <ul> <li>This first phase is to widen parts of Harrier Way and A34.</li> <li>In order to do this safely, a new temporary road layout will be created. These works include:</li> <li>Site clearance, utility diversions and drainage improvements</li> <li>Temporary works to enable future traffic management arrangements</li> <li>Carriageway widening, to ensure safe working areas for construction</li> <li>Footway works, to maintain access</li> <li>Structural works for the new bridge at Birchfield Island.</li> </ul> |
| 5 | Will the flyover still be in operation<br>throughout this phase of the<br>works? | Yes, during this phase of works the flyover will remain in<br>use as at present. The flyover will be demolished in a<br>later phase of works this winter.  |
| 6 | Why are you making lane closures?  | Lane closures will be made to ensure the safety of the<br>workforce and all road users whilst the works are taking<br>place.   |
| 7 | Where will the lane closures be and when?  | There will be a variety of lane closures and layout<br>changes on all affected roads, which will be<br>communicated in advance in a range of ways, including<br>via <u>www.birmingham.gov.uk/perry-barr-regen</u> .  |
| 8 | How do you intend to manage traffic and congestion during the works?             | There will be clear signage and full Traffic Management<br>will be in place. This will be complemented by media and<br>social media activity to promote the works.   |

| 9  | Will One Stop Shopping be open as usual?  | Yes.   |
| 10 | Will I be able to enter and leave<br>One Stop Shopping in the usual<br>way by car / on foot?                                | Access to One Stop Shopping will be maintained at all times.   |
| 11 | Will the works affect deliveries to the One Stop Centre?  | No. Access for deliveries will be maintained.  |
| 12 | Will the bus services operate in the normal way?  | The bus services will operate as normal. Any changes to<br>the services will be notified in the usual way. For more<br>information on timetables go to <u>www.wmnetwork.co.uk</u>  |
| 13 | How can I plan my journey to work?  | To better plan your journeys to and from Perry Barr, visit<br>www.wmnetwork.co.uk/plan-your-journey  |
| 14 | How will cyclists be affected by the<br>works and what steps are being<br>taken to ensure cyclists are kept<br>safe?        | Cyclists who are confident cycling on the highway will be<br>able to continue to do so as at present. Once complete,<br>this scheme will extend the A34 cycle route to Perry Barr<br>centre, with ambitions to continue the route further<br>north.                      |
| 15 | As a pedestrian, will I be able to<br>cross the A34 at all times from the<br>One Stop Junction through to<br>Aldridge Road? | Yes. Pedestrian crossing facilities will be available at all<br>times. Where necessary, pedestrian diversions will be<br>introduced.   |
| 16 | There are lots of construction projects in this area, won't this work put their completion dates at risk?                   | All works that form part of the regeneration of Perry Barr<br>have been carefully planned and coordinated to ensure<br>the timely completion of all schemes.   |
| 17 | What happens once this phase of works is completed?   | Once this phase is completed, we will then move on to<br>the next phase of works, which will focus on dismantling<br>the flyover and completing the new bridge at Birchfield<br>Island.  |
