Bitesize Procurement : Operating Lease vs Finance Lease What is the difference?

What is an operating lease?

An operating lease is a lease for an asset that the business does not own, commonly found with items such as photocopiers. The school would pay a monthly rent for the photocopier but if it breaks down the school would call the photocopier company who would come out to fix it. At the end of the lease the photocopier company come and collect the photocopier and take it away.

What is a finance lease?

A finance lease (also known as a sales lease or capital lease) is a lease for anything that is not an operating lease, for example a lease on a car. With a finance lease you own the asset at the end of the lease period, however you would also be liable for the cost of repairs during the lease period; the lease transfers the risk and reward to the school during the lease period and at the end of the lease period the school would usually purchase the asset for a reduced price.

How this relates to procurement

When you are looking to take out either an operating lease or a finance lease you must take into consideration whole life costs, with a finance lease this will extend past the lease period as you will own the asset and you will also need to factor in costs of any potential repairs during the lease period.

With an operating lease please make sure that you examine the lease agreement for any cost for the removal of the asset at the end of the lease period.

Please remember to always follow your schools own financial procedures.

Keeping Compliant during uncertain times

We understand that you may be struggling to purchase certain items at this present time due to demand pressures on suppliers. Please can you ensure that you continue to use BCC contracted suppliers wherever possible so that you remain protected by BCC terms and conditions as well as the favourable pricing.

If you are unable to source essential supplies/ provisions using the contracted providers please remember that you must continue to abide by schools procedures including seeking VFM and ensuring that if you sign any contracts with suppliers that you fully understand and agree to their terms and conditions, and that these decisions are approved by governors where applicable.

Finding a supplier

Requesting quotations through Finditinbirmingham will be much quicker and require less effort than approaching potential suppliers directly. It will also make your supply needs known to a large number of potential suppliers. Better value for money should therefore result.

To minimise the need for estimations and to ensure correct billing, please submit your meterreads regularly.

When should I send my meter reads?

Meter reads can be submitted at any time, but for accurate billing please submit:

Electricity meter reads: between 20th and 28th of each month Gas meter reads: from 25th to the last day of each month

How do I give you my meter reads?

1 - The easiest way to submit meter reads is online by clicking here.

2 - You can also do this by calling our Customer Care Team on 0333 003 7874, selecting option 3, then option 1 for gas / option 2 for electricity.

3 - Alternatively, email your meter reads to GP.redhill.WME.BirminghamCity@totalgp.com along with your MPAN/MPR and account number.
