	taking part in activities at this point.
	Do you have any Covid-19 symptoms? Please follow the current government
	advice on self-isolation.
Before litter picking	<ul> <li>Always let a member of your family know where you are going and when you</li> </ul>
	are expected home
	✓ Carry a mobile phone in case of emergencies
	(If you have one).
	✓ Remember to take hand sanitiser, gloves and a litter picker if you have one.
During litter picking	Always use gloves and litter pickers when collecting litter.
	Try to wear reflective or light-coloured clothing.
	✓ Wear strong boots or shoes.
	✓ Be aware of your surroundings.
	✓ Please follow the current government social distancing guidelines, 2 metres.
After litter picking	<ul> <li>Place any rubbish in a strong waste bag or double bag your rubbish. Place</li> </ul>
	collected rubbish in a Birmingham City Council bin.
	Always wash your hands after litter picking.
	Inform the council of any problems or issues that you may have noticed;

Do not	<ul> <li>X Handle any needles or sharp objects.</li> <li>X Pick up any discarded face masks or gloves with your hands, use litter</li> </ul>
	pickers and place immediately in a bag.
	X Litter pick on or near any busy roads.
	X Work in or near any watercourses.
	X Lift anything that is too heavy.
	X Work when it is dark or unsafe.
	X Approach any unknown people.
	X Work when you are tired.
