The Fox Hollies Road to Walmley Road Junction is already "<u>Gridlocked"</u> from 8.30am -9.00am and 3.00pm to 3.30pm every weekday, with Parents (the "Balmy Army") Parking cars to take the children to the Deanery Primary School In Fox Hollies Road.

Commuter traffic going down Fox Holies Road to Wylde Green Road cannot get past the Fox Hollies Road /Webster Way Island due to the Parents Parking cars to take the children to the Deanery Primary School In Fox Hollies Road.

The <u>current situation</u> is not acceptable, never mind in 2031, and were it not for the Crossing lady outside the Deanery School, a fatal accident would already have occurred.

In the above document that I have read: I have not seen any reference to the Reopening of Penn's Lane Railway Station. This was proposed by Alan Marshal, the Editorial Director of Rail News.co.uk, and published in the Birmingham Post at the beginning of 2014.

As Mr Marshall explains: this would significantly relieve congestion from Walmley on the A38 Tyburn Road and the Aston Expressway (Ref Page 10, Item 3.2, Fig 3.3 and 3.6)
