Monitoring Performance

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 The attached report lists the Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) associated with the delivery of the Police and Crime Plan 2021-2025 and the Police and Crime Commissioner's statement regarding the local contribution to achieving the National Crime and Policing Measures.

2. Recommendation

That the Panel note the information contained in the report.

3. Background and Panel Role

- 3.1 The Police and Crime Panel provides the 'checks and balances' in relation to the performance of the Police and Crime Commissioner. The Police and Crime Plan is the key document by which the performance of the Commissioner is measured.
- 3.2 Guidance for Police and Crime Panels published by the Local Government Association highlights the importance of regular updates on the Commissioner's performance in delivering, resourcing, and achieving his priorities.

... This will support the panel in scrutinising the commissioner's annual report(s), enable it to better understand the strategic policing and crime (and fire and rescue) landscape, and ensure that it is able to offer the best possible support to the commissioner.

- 3.3 The Police and Crime Commissioner has committed to present quarterly monitoring reports to the Panel. The attached report provides an initial overview of the KPIs associated with the delivery of the Police and Crime Plan.
- 3.4 As the Panel develops its approach to analysing performance, it will be important for members to have a clear understanding of the Commissioner's performance framework, and how the panel can support the Police and Crime Commissioner and add value to the performance monitoring process.

4. National Crime and Policing Measures

- 4.1 The attached report also explains the Police and Crime Commissioner's responsibilities within the new National Policing and Crime Measures. The Government has published 6 national priorities for policing against which local performance will be reviewed:

- reduce murder and other homicide;
- reduce serious violence;
- disrupt drugs supply and county lines;
- reduce neighbourhood crime;
- tackle cyber-crime; and
- improve satisfaction among victims with a particular focus on victims of domestic abuse.

4.2 The attached report includes the Police and Crime Commissioner' quarterly statement on the contribution of their force to achieving improvements against these national priorities.
