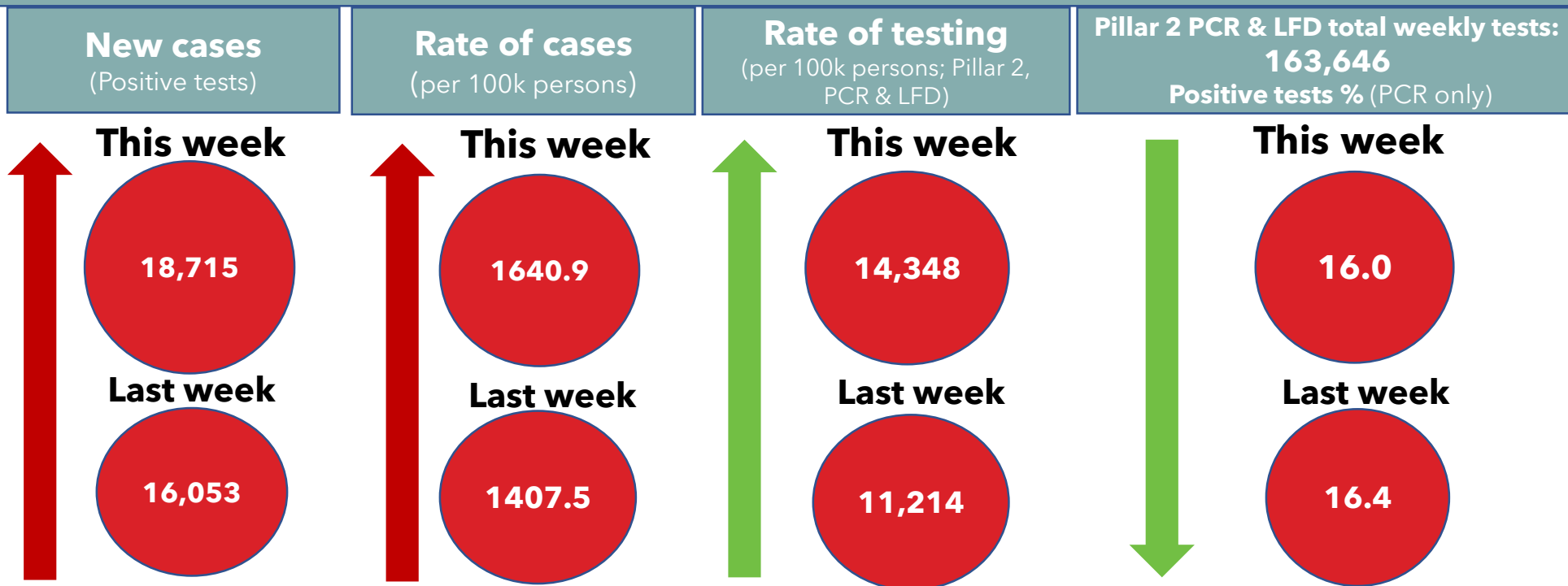

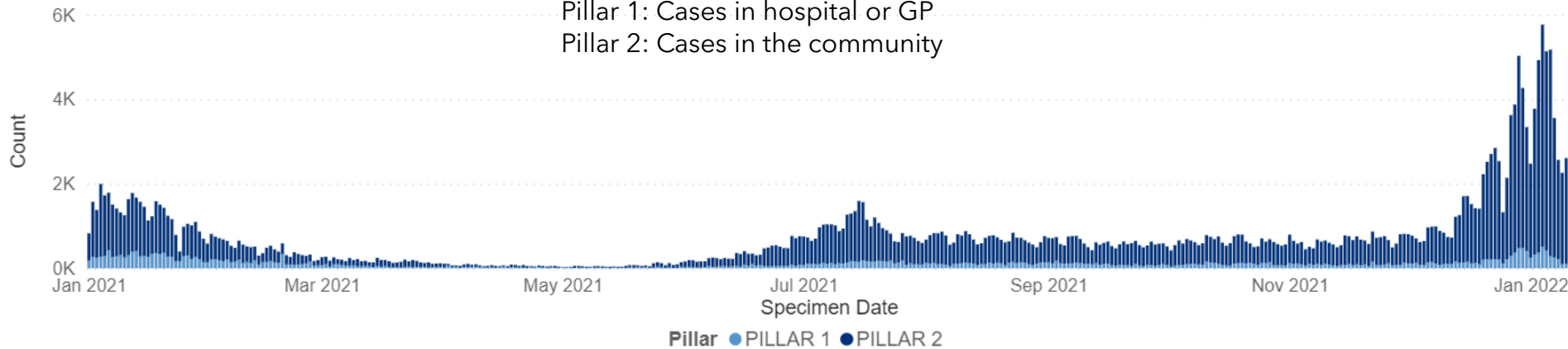
In week which reported 18 deaths. the 7 days up to 7th January 2022, new cases and the overall case rate continue to increase. The % of positive PCR tests has decreased slightly, with overall testing rates using PCR and LFD increasing.

All adults are encouraged to do regular home testing using the rapid Lateral Flow Tests. The test kits are available at community pharmacies and council collection points [across the city](#), or you can also order online for home delivery directly from the government for [free by post](#).

In hospitals across the city, admissions ranged between 63 and 111 new cases a day in the week ending 7th January (total = 614), an increase of 24% when compared to last week's admissions of between 44 and 110 new daily cases (total = 495). There were 17 deaths reported this week in Birmingham, a marginal decrease from the previous



Positive Tests by Specimen Date & Pillar



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This week, the total number of cases identified in Birmingham was 18,715 cases, compared to 16,053 cases reported in the previous week, an increase of 16.6%.

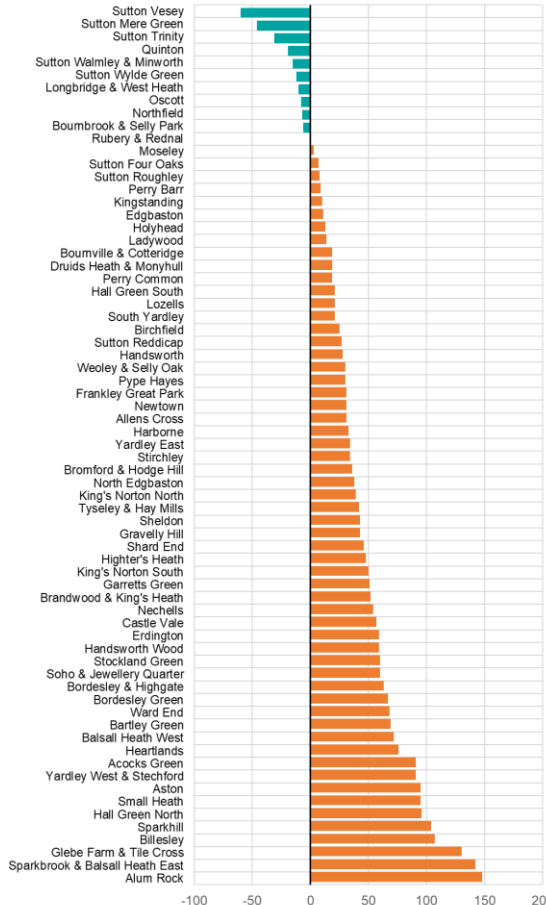

Compared to previous week, cases increased in all age groups this week except 80+, which showed no change. The largest increase was 84%, in the 0-19 age group, followed by increases of 10% in 40-59, and 3% in the 20-39 and 60-79 age groups respectively.

Cases increased in all ethnic groups this week. The Asian ethnic group showed the largest increase of 55%, followed by increases of 39% in the Mixed/Other ethnic group, 13% in the Black ethnic group, and 5% in the White ethnic group.

Change in weekly cases compared to the previous week

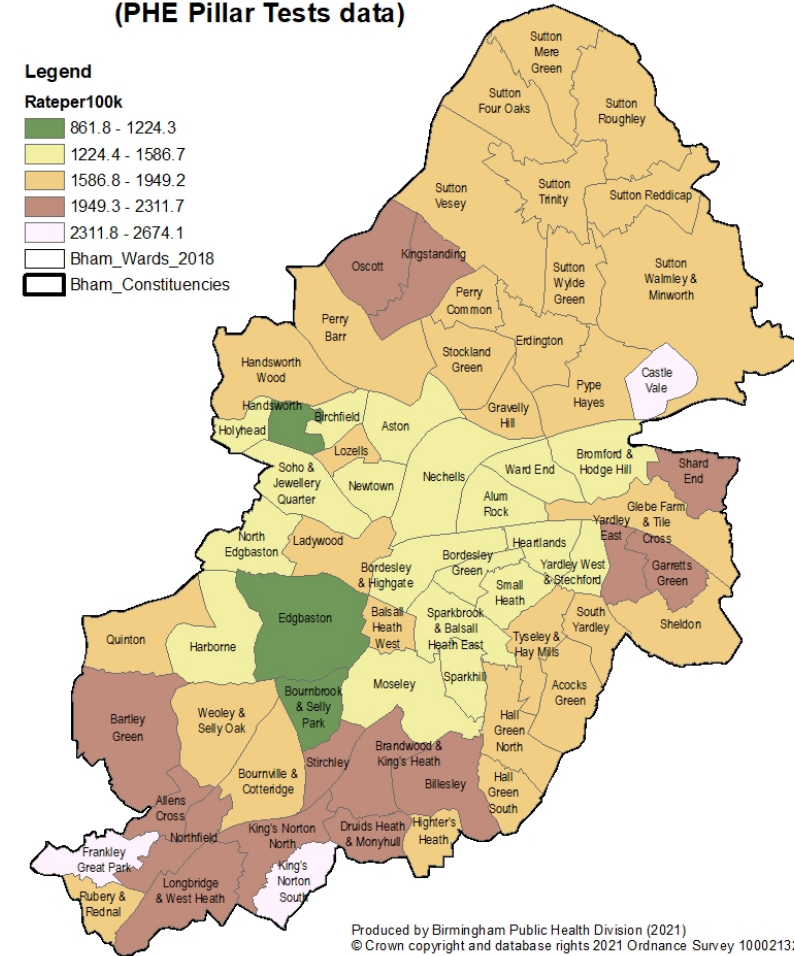
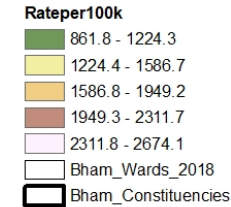


Comparison of seven-day total cases from 31 Dec to 07 Jan by ward level covering Birmingham.

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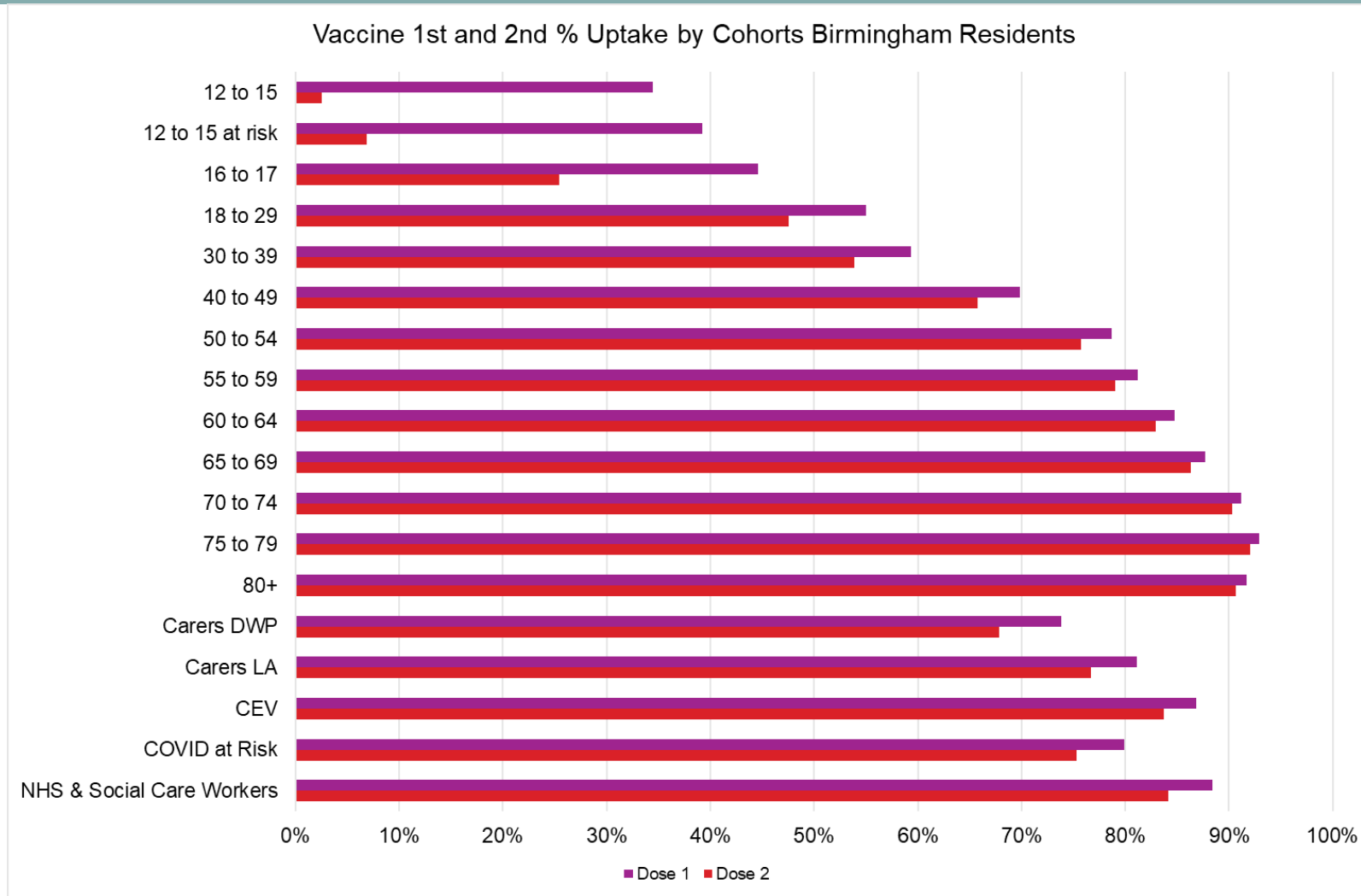

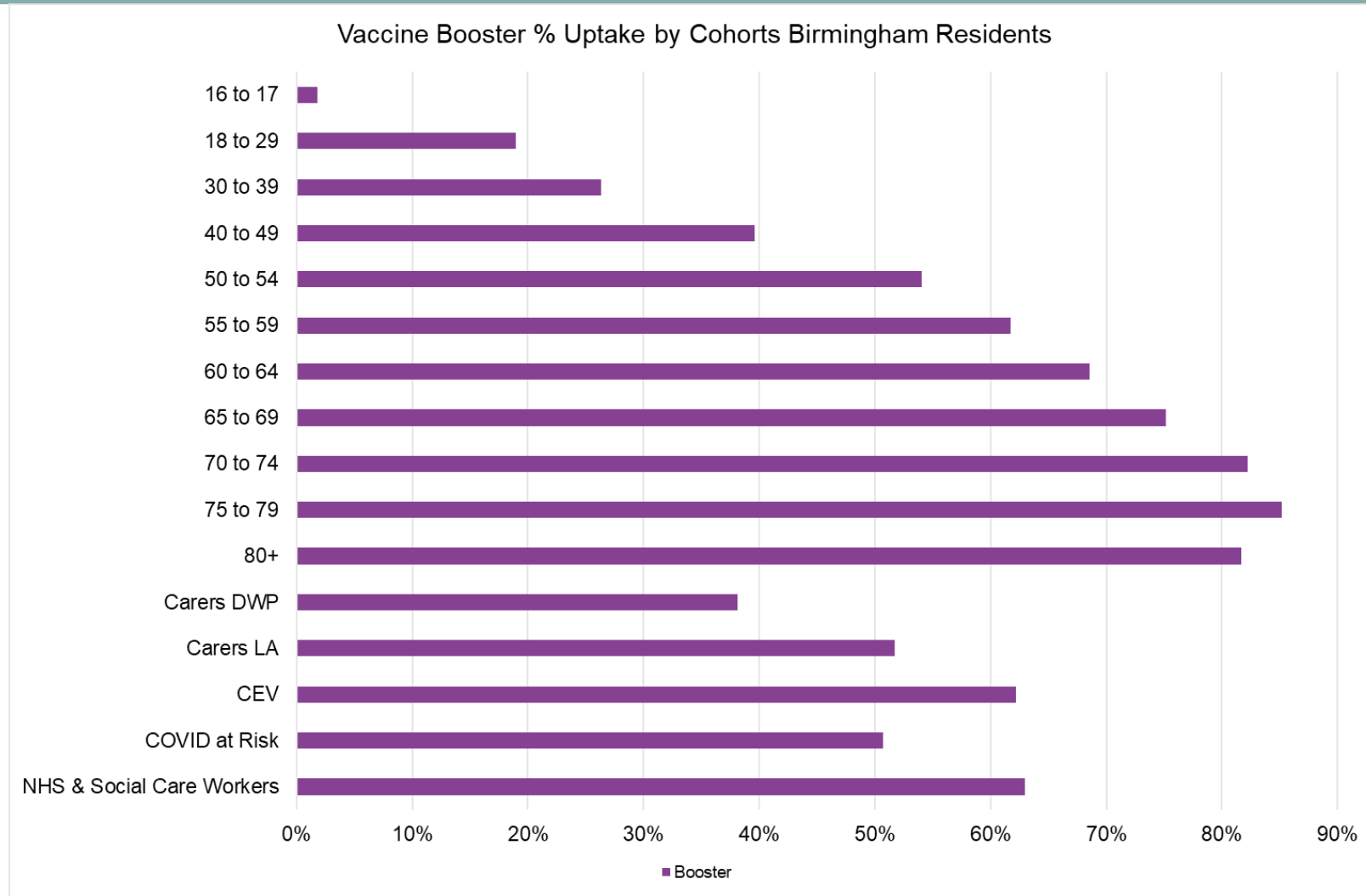
Uptake by Cohort in Birmingham Residents - 1st and 2nd doses
