Bill,

I hope you're well.

I am the acting 2IC/supervisor for the Stechford & Yardley North Neighbourhood Team in the absence of my Sergeant. I attended the unlawful encampment on Station Road, Stechford (Next to Cascades) with you on Thursday.

We have obviously served the occupants of the site with the S77 notices which I am aware expire on 25/11/2021 at 23:59hrs but I wanted to let you know of a few incidents that took place last night.

Firstly a burglary took place on Westacre Gardens yesterday (19/11/2021) offenders broke into a house and then subsequently stole a red Ford Fiesta. First log created.

A short while later the said stolen Ford Fiesta was seen behind the unlawful encampment being smashed up by 4 young white males (13-16yrs) who were seen coming and going by members of the public from the site through broken fencing. This vehicle was then driven onto the parkland behind the site ripping up the grass, smashing into the play areas, driving into fences that are perimeter fences of members of the public's gardens and crashing into street furniture and bins. Second log created.

Officers from Force Response located the stolen vehicle in the parkland and unfortunately no one was with it. The officers in attendance were then met with completely unacceptable hostile behaviour whereby items including large stones, lumps of concrete and other items were thrown at the officers causing them to have to request more officers and tactically withdraw from the location for their own safety. Third log created.

I am also aware of some of the vehicles on the site having been linked to other offences in the local area since they have arrived at the site on Station Road. The members within this unlawful encampment are now not only having an affect on the members of the community around them but also on the demand placed on West midlands Police due to the calls for service regarding a rise in criminal offences being recorded in the area since their arrival.

When I spoke with you on Thursday you asked to be notified if there was a surge in offences being recorded or they could be linked to offences or anti social behaviour in the area. Slowly but surely this is becoming the case.

I am aware that no arrest's were made by response yesterday and that the duty inspector at the time made the decision that no officers were to enter the site.

Where do we now stand with taking further action?. Is it a case of we have to wait for the S77 notice to expire because it has been served and risk a further rise in crime or Anti Social Behaviour in the area or are there more effective/immediate measures that can be put in place due to the incidents that are occurring.

Does the Respondent have any vulnerability?

e.g. Learning difficulty? Victim of Domestic Abuse? None identified. The Council and WM Police have engaged with the group on multiple occasions. Welfare assessments have been made but no significant needs have been recorded for education or medical sign posting.

It is possible that members of an unauthorised encampment would have vulnerabilities that they have not declared. However, this group is moving regularly in Birmingham. No indication of any particular Birmingham based service has been identified and that would necessitate the group remaining in Birmingham. There are transit sites in Birmingham, Sandwell Dudley Wolverhampton that are alternatives to Open spaces in Birmingham.

If an encampment is set up, the impact on the local community, businesses and park users, who also are likely to have a variety of protected characteristics and vulnerabilities, and who will include children will be severe.

I do not believe the persons on site are disabled or at least disabled and not supported by others on the site to appoint there would be a detriment.

It is possible that some members of any unauthorised encampment may have disabilities. Individual members of encampments may well have protected characteristics under the 2010 Act. There may be children, elderly people and/or disabled people present.

The Council also has duties to make arrangements to ensure that its functions are discharged having regard to the need to safeguard and promote the welfare of children under s.11 Children Act 2004.

The proposed order is intended to prevent this group setting up encampments in the first place. If an encampment is set up, the impact on the local community and park users, who also are likely to have a variety of protected characteristics and vulnerabilities, and who will include children, will be severe.

The life style is about travelling and therefore there is nothing to indicate that there is significant risk of affecting someone who has a protected characteristic under the Equality Act 2010 from residing in Birmingham as it does allow them to come in and trade, shop and use facilities/services just not reside on land they have no rights to settle upon.

What impact is the behaviour having on victims/wider community/partner resources?

There are significant levels of nuisance, harassment alarm and distress caused to residents from this group.

This is evidenced by complaints to Police and Council and in the statements submitted.

In particular there has been offensive comments, driving vehicles at school children, guns being pointed at children, air rifles being shot at residential premises, windows being broken with stones being thrown at premises and use of a catapult and potentially involved in a burglary. There have also been significant levels of waste and criminal damage to sites. The costs to clean up sites following them moving off from significant levels of litter and waste, left on sites after they are vacated. significant levels of defecation on sites after they have been vacated.

the grassed areas of the parks have been damaged by vehicles being raced and driven in a dangerous manner. Threatening abusive and aggressive behaviour. The settled community have been unable to use and enjoy the open land.

Residents in the area surrounding the parks have also been affected including damage to residents' property, abusive and threatening behaviour.

This has led to concern for public order and safety, harm to good community relations and residents feeling unable to enjoy being in their own homes.

Unauthorised encampments are costing the Council and the local police significant sums of money at a time when there are limited resources for the provision of public services.

Residents and park users also have relevant protected characteristics, such as age and disability especially given the use of the parks and their facilities by children and young people, schools and clubs, and the location in the surrounding areas of sheltered accommodation and a hospice.

Has re-housing been considered and by who or any other tools powers? Provide reasons for decision making process

No.

Re-housing would be considered if an application were made. However, this group is a community that lives in mobile caravans and choses to move around the country. Many in our experience have a winter base to return to but it is not known if these do.

Have you had due regard to the Public Sector Equality Act (s.149 Equality Act 2010)?

(Please see Appendix 1 attached)

Yes. It is accepted that travellers have a relevant protected characteristic and that individual members of the community may well have other protected characteristics, though in relation to any prospective encampment, it is unknown what protected characteristics may be present. However these proceedings have been brought because of the sensitive nature of unauthorised encampments on open land being tolerated by the council when there is severe levels of ASB towards the settled community.

Birmingham Council have on numerous occasions tolerated travellers, Council officers have carried out welfare assessments, allowed travellers time to remain on sites because of welfare issues The Council have identified needs amongst travellers in respect of education, health and housing and made referrals to the relevant agencies. The Council has sought to advance equality of opportunity and foster good relations between travellers and the settled community. The presence of this encampment group in unsuitable and sensitive locations and the level of anti-social behaviour on the unauthorised encampments is having a significant impact on local amenities, the local environment, neighbouring properties, public order and safety, and good community relations. Regard has also been had to the duty under s.11 Children Act 2004. These proceedings are in the public interest and proportionate.

Summarise why the proposed action is considered to be necessary and proportionate

Parks and open land are wholly unsuitable for travellers' encampments and such encampments cannot be permitted or tolerated there. More significant are the levels of nuisance harassment alarm and distress caused to residents from this group. This is evidenced by complaints to Police and Council and in the statements submitted.

This group is responsible for criminal damage to Parks significant levels of litter and waste, left on sites after they are vacated. Significant levels of defecation on sites after they have been vacated.

The grassed areas of the parks, have been damaged by vehicles being raced and driven in a dangerous manner Threatening abusive and aggressive behaviour. The settled community have been unable to use and

enjoy the open land.

Residents in the area surrounding this group's encampments have suffered criminal damage, threats and guns being pointed at school children and air rifles being fired at residential premises. Residents have also been affected including faeces and used toilet papers being left near residents premises, damage to residents' property, abusive and threatening behaviour.

This has led to concern for public order and safety, harm to good community relations and residents feeling unable to enjoy being in their own homes.

The behaviour of travellers on unauthorised encampments on these unauthorised encampments has impacted on residents, businesses and the council. Unauthorised encampments are costing the Council and the local police significant sums of money at a time when there are limited resources for the provision of public services. The Council have had to pay for the clean-up costs, bailiffs fees, the cost of repair work following the departure of each unauthorised encampment. The settled community and park users also have protected characteristics, vulnerabilities, rights and needs.

It has reached a stage where balancing the needs of the settled community, park users and the travelling community the balance is in favour of the settled community, and I believe an injunction is both necessary and proportionate.

I can confirm that I have reviewed this case and the facts above and believe that the action suggested is necessary and proportionate means to achieving a legitimate aim.



I, Richard Fieldhouse, of Birmingham City Council, will say as follows:

- 1. I am Richard Fieldhouse I have worked as an Enforcement Officer for the Environmental Department at Birmingham City Council for approximately 9 ½ months.
- 2. The information contained in this statement comes from my own knowledge.
- 3. This statement is my findings after gathering evidence following a Traveller Encampment that had been present at Billesley Park. I deemed it necessary to revisit the site after previously taking a statement from E1 after a robbery that had taken place on 18th October 21 additional information required included CCTV and photography. I visited the encampment area on Tuesday 26th October and then proceeded to BCC compound which is located on 665 Yardley Wood Road, Billesley, B13 OHN on Wednesday 27th October.
- 4. I arrived at Billesley Park on Tuesday at 13.00hrs and started walking around the area taking photographs as I was proceeding around the park, it was evident that vehicles from the encampment had driven over the grass near the bollard to gain access at some point as there was visible tyre marks on the grass visible. Images RF1/1, RF1/2 & RF1/3
- 5. There was fresh tyre marks noted all over the park, when walking to look at the tyre marks I spotted a watch and strap upon closer inspection it was a RADO watch with a leather strap(1) I placed took a photo and placed this in my pocket RF1/5 & RF1/6.
- 6. Imagery was taken at the of the back of the BCC depot which is adjacent to the park to help me visualise departure areas for the equipment's removal from the depot. There was a strong indication that the equipment was being passed over the fence and this is what CCTV RF3 indicated as burglars where carrying kit in that direction. Image RF1/8, RF1/9, RF1/10, RF1/11, RF1/12, RF1/13. Upon inspecting the fences there was an over growth of bushes and plantation, which is where I noticed a commercial tool (no battery), I picked up the drill as a precaution and I notified the police that I had found it and where. Image RF1/14& RF1/15.
- 7. Upon looking around the park you could see that the grounds had heavily been damaged by cars racing around "doughnutting" with a vast amount of tyre tread prints present, this had been mentioned by an employee at BCC on my first visit on 22/10/21 as they

- had witnessed it and mentioned it in conversation but they wished not to give any evidence. Imagery RF1/16, RF1/17 & RF1/18.
- 8. Imagery RF1/19 RF1/20 & RF1/21- demonstrated that there had been a steel post present but upon the day of inspection it was missing and appeared to have been forcibly removed.
- 9. On Wednesday 27th October I met up with a BCC employee who wishes not to be named due to fearing any possible repercussions from the travellers, for purposes of this statement I will refer to him as E2.
- 10. At 11.30hrs I arrived at the premises and met E2, I advised them that I would like a better understanding of the events that took place on 18th October 21 along with another tour of the premises to help me understand the incident better.E2 informed me that he had been looking through CCTV and that he had discovered additional footage that he though may be of importance. After quickly reviewing the footage I asked E2 to show me the areas where the perpetrators could be seen on CCTV.
- 11. E2 took me to the main storage area where he confirmed that all the trucks where placed in that building that evening and its evidential on RF3 that products are being removed from the premises by several individuals at 21.20hrs on 17th October 2021. We then proceeded to the entry point RF2/1 which is where there was a shutter which got shunted up so that someone could gain access and roll under, its possible that a tyre was used to hold the shutter up as you can see a tyre roll across the tarmac and someone runs after it to bring it back. Image RF2/2 door was used for the individuals to come in and out of through the early hours of the morning remove equipment from the storage unit.
- 12. Within the unit there was an alarm system, and this is activated through motion sensors that are at waist height at the entrance to the unit behind the shutters (infa red beam). On the evening and morning in question the alarm did go off and police officers attended the scene between 22.00hrs & 23.00hrs. The sensors where damaged at the time of the break in Images RF2/4, RF2/5, RF2/6 & RF2/7.
- 13. E2 confirmed that the equipment that was present on the inspection is the norm, Illustrated in RF2/8 & RF2/ and E2 also highlighted items that where in the storage unit where undisrupted and not taken on the burglary including the heavy red lock up boxes,

- it was pointed out that they were possibly too heavy to lift over the fence. The key focus for the burglars was the gardening equipment which was located in the steel lock up camouflaged by a timber surround. Image RF2/10
- 14. Access to the lock up requires a special hex key that is placed in the centre of the door to unlock the deadbolt E2 showed me how to gain access to the lock up, if you are locked inside there is no way out other that the way you got in. Images RF2/11 & RF2/12 demonstrates locking system.
- 15. Access was gained to the lock up via an access panel that was cut into the side after removing the timber by some form of grinding tool. Image RF2/13 & RF2/14, 3 slots where cut into the panel and then then folded down to create a small opening. The opening was very small allowing 30cm (12 inches) in height due to an internal steel shelf blocking access and measured 34cm (13.4 inches) approx. in length, all 87 stolen products that were taken from the lock up would of have to of been placed through the hole. RF2/15, RF2/16, RF2/17, RF2/18, RF2/19, RF2/20, RF2/21, RF2/22 & RF2/23.
- 16. After reviewing the storage unit E2 then proceeded to show me outside where individuals which where seen on CCTV RF3 where carrying items towards after removing from the unit RF2/25, RF2/26, RF2/27, the presumption was that they where thrown over the fence, E2 also highlighted that one of the caravans have been parked in very close proximity to the fences during the duration of the travellers stay.
- 17. E2 showed me additional damage that was done to one of the shutters RF2/24 where it shows two grinder marks where someone was attempting to gain access, after reviewing the CCTV there where torches visible in this area at 03.30hrs on 18th October 2021. After completing a full walk around of the yard, I went back to the office with E2 so that CCTV for the incident could be reviewed.
- 18. VID-202111027-WA0064.mp4 was taken and I will refer to this as RF3, imagery was taken from 21.20hrs on 17th October 21 until 03.30hrs 18th October 2021.At 21.22hrs (RF3) several individuals are spotted carrying tools from the large unit and taking them to the fenced (railings) area at the rear of the unit near the park.
- 19. The CCTV then highlights individuals breaking into a shutter at the bottom of the yard entry point RF1/1, as soon as the burglars are in, they switch the lights on. At 03.19hrs

- you can see vast amounts of equipment being removed and taken to the area which leads to RF2/27 lasting for approximately 10 minutes.
- 20. Whilst reviewing the CCTV E2 confirmed when I was last on site on 22nd October that a bike had been stolen and the individual can be seen scoping the area out, I went through the CCTV ref RF4 (VID-20211027-WA0063.mp4) with EC and it was evident that the individual strolls onto the premises, he spots the bike, he then continues to check the car door after covering his hand with his sleeve, after that he wonders around further into the yard behind the skip & tractor getting closer to the diesel storage area and then suddenly spots the police who are in the neighbouring area on the encampment site with the environmental health, the individual scarpers half way across the drive then remembers that there is a bike there, he then proceeds to go back and steel the bike. Having spoken to E2 I asked if the bike had been reported stolen and he informed me no as his colleague has another bike but also said "why bother they won't catch anyone for it" At 13.00hrs I left site.
- 21. I am willing to attend court to give evidence in support of this application.
- 22. I exhibit marked RF1 a copy of photos taken on Tuesday 22nd October 2021
- 23. I exhibit marked on RF2 a copy of photos taken on Wednesday 23rd October 2021
- 24. I exhibit marked on RF3 a copy of CCTV footage taken on 23rd October corresponding to the incident that took place in the early hours of Monday morning on 18th October 2021.
- 25. I exhibit marked on RF4 a copy of CCTV footage taken on 23rd October corresponding to the incident that took place on Friday 22nd October 2021 at 09.33hrs



Image 1 – Billesley Park Entrance


































Image 3 - Damaged Motion sensor near shutter — low level




Image 6 - Damaged Alarm Sensor to lock up room area




Image 7 - Additional Damaged Alarm Sensor




Image 9- Equipment – not taken within storage area




Image 10 - Steel lock up unit — Covered by timber — note whole cut in side Panel — Special hex key required to open




Image 11 - Door Access point to storage container with the hex key




Image 12 - Internal of door, no way of opening from the inside, highlighting that all goods went through the access panel.




Image 14 - External to storage container — timber has been removed and access has been cut with a grinder.




Image 18 - Internal access area demonstrating shelving areas




Image 19 - External measurements — Height cut was approx. 45cm long however shelving in way internally
