
In the 7 days up to 26 March, 5,473 cases (479.9/100K) were reported, a 18.8% increase compared to the previous 7 days 4,605 cases (403.8/100k). The % of positive tests has also increased but the rate of testing has decreased from the previous week.


Free testing will end for most people from 1 April, including regular testing of students in education settings. Some limited ongoing free testing will include:

- Limited symptomatic testing available for a small number of at-risk groups (further guidance to be issued on which groups will be eligible).
- o Free symptomatic testing will remain available to social care staff.

Hospital admissions continue to increase. In the most recent 7 days up to 25 March 363 new cases were admitted, a 15% increase, compared to 315 admissions the previous week.

In contrast, Covid-related deaths are relatively low. In the 7 days up to 24 March have decreased by 75%, 2 deaths were reported compared to 8 deaths reported in the previous week.

### Weekly Report: 20 March to 26 March 2022

The **28-Day PCR testing rate** up to 26 March was 1,933/100k, a decrease of 52.8% compared to the previous 28 days (4,099/100k). The % of positive PCR testing (Pillar 2) in the recent 28 days (26.1%), an increase of 38.1% compared to the previous 28 days (18.9%).

In the last 7 days for both LFD and PCR test rates have decreased by 17.7% compared to previous week.


**Cases** over a longer period are declining in Birmingham. In the last 28 days (up to 26 March), 15,033 cases (1,318.1/100k) were reported, a decrease of 3.9% compared to previous 28 days,15,643 cases (1,371.6/100k).

However, recent figures suggest cases are increasing. In the 7 days up to 26 March, 5,473 cases (equivalent to 479.9/100K) were reported, a 18.8% increase compared to the previous 7 days (4,605 cases, 403.8/100k).


The **five wards** with the highest case rates (cases per 100,000 population) in the 28-day period are:

- Sutton Four Oaks (3,139.1)
- Sutton Mere Green (3,018.6)
- Sutton Roughley (3,018.0)
- Sutton Trinity (2,847.0)
- Sutton Wylde Green (2,631.0)

#### Birmingham PCR Testing (Pillar 2): Testing rate per 100K 22 February to 21 March 2022




#### Birmingham Case Rates (Pillar 1 & Pillar 2) 27 February to 26 March 2022







## **Uptake in Birmingham Residents -1st, 2nd and Booster Doses**




- Uptake of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and booster doses remain consistently lower amongst under-50s compared to over-50s.
- Identified vulnerable groups including over-65s, clinically extremely vulnerable and COVID at-risk cohorts show good uptake of 1st and 2nd doses, with booster uptake between 50% and 65%.
- Booster uptake in NHS and social care workers is lower compared to the uptake of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> doses.
- CEV clinically extremely vulnerable group at risk of severe illness from COVID-19
- Carers LA/DWP Carers under local authority or Department for Work and Pensions jurisdiction





- The table highlights the wards with less than 60% uptake.
- As with 1st dose, areas with less than 60% uptake of the 2nd dose still appear to be concentrated in the centre of Birmingham.
- Handsworth Wood achieved 60% in late-January, Garretts Green achieved 60% in late-February, and Glebe Farm and Tile Cross achieved 60% in late March.

## COVID-19 Vaccine Uptake Booster Dose, aged 12+ (wards with less than 60% uptake)

- With the exception of the Northern/more affluent areas, less than 60% booster uptake is widespread in other parts of Birmingham.
- Uptake in Bournville & Cotteridge (61.9%) and Northfield (64.4%) is higher than its surrounding areas in the South, with less than 60% uptake.
- Sutton Reddicap achieved 60% in early-February.
