The Birmingham in Bloom competition has been running for several years for all of our council and leasehold tenants, resident groups and local communities.







New categories in 2020

Young Neighbour Award

 (under 25s) – This award
 is for young people who
 are the pride of their
 neighbourhood. Someone
 who has overcome adversity
 and succeeded, either in
 personal accomplishments,
 or through giving back to
 their community.

Good Neighbourhood Award (over 25s) –

This awards tenants or leaseholders who have given back to their community, either as a volunteer (such as an HLB member, block inspector, RA member, etc.) or a neighbour who goes above and beyond to give a helping hand to those around them.

Tenant Led Group Award –
 This is awarded to groups
 with a co-regulated tenant
 group who gets involved in

their area by making estate improvements or undertaking litter picks, putting on activities for local people, providing services to the community or running their local community centre.

Award – In this category we are looking for an individual or group that has been created to keep people safe,

prevent crime, and/or support victims of a crime.

Awards – This award is an opportunity for tenants and leaseholders to nominate a member of Birmingham City Council staff working in the neighbourhood who put tenants at the heart of what they do. *Please note – only nominations from tenants and leaseholders will be accepted

for this category which gives recognition to tenants and residents for their contribution to community involvement and tenant engagement.

A focus group was formed with previous winners of Birmingham in Bloom to add tenant engagement categories that give recognition to a wider group of residents for their contribution in transforming and caring for their neighbourhoods.

Unfortunately, there will be no citywide Birmingham in Bloom this year because we are in the process of reviewing the process for future competition.
