The SPD was modified in response to comments received during the public consultation period on the draft SPD undertaken between November 2020 and February 2021.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Birmingham Design SPD may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- a) the document is not within the appropriate powers conferred by Part 2 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004;
- b) a procedural requirement of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 has not been complied with.

Any such application must be made promptly, and in any event no later than the end of the period of six weeks of the date of the adoption of the Birmingham Design SPD.
