## Growth Fund 2023/24

## What changes have the Department for Education (DFE) made to National Growth Fund Allocations to Local Authorities

As with 2022/23, for 2023/24 the DFE will allocate growth funding at Local Authority (LA) level, based on the observed differences between primary and secondary pupils at schools within each MSOA (Middle Layer Super Output Area) in the October 2021 and October 2022 censuses. Only positive MSOA growth will be used in calculating the number of pupils to be funded.

The DFE are not making any changes to the ways in which Local Authorities can distribute growth funding.

The maximum reduction in growth funding for any LA will be set at -0.5% of their total Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) schools block allocation in 2023/24 – before a safety net is applied.
