

73% of the Indian community speak English as their main language. This is compared to 84% of the Birmingham population. 7% cannot speak English well or at all.




13% of the Indian community listed Panjabi as their main language. 5% listed Gujarati, 1% Tamil and 1% Urdu.

Indian people in Birmingham identify themselves as British or English only. 10,265 people have an Indian only identity.





